Palm Sunday, April 5 11:00 a.m. We will celebrate "virtual" communion




Easter Sunday, April 12 11:00 a.m.

Dear Friends,

In these strange and unprecedented days, as we cope with the necessary restrictions to fight the spread of the coronavirus Covid-19, it has been a challenge trying to figure out how to keep our church members connected when we have to be apart from one another for health reasons. I have seen some humorous posts on Facebook. One showed a picture of a carnival dunking booth with the caption, "Social Distancing Baptistry." A cartoon showed a priest tossing a wafer to an open-mouthed church member who was standing behind a red line and velvet rope. The caption read, "Coronavirus Communion." Someone wrote, "This is the Lentiest Lent I have ever Lented." In the same vein. someone else commented, "I never intended to give up this much for Lent."

Also, inaccurately, some people posted that the Pope had canceled Easter. A search of headlines shows that the Vatican had canceled public participation in Easter celebrations and that the Pope will not lead any public celebration for Easter. Unfortunately, we have had to

make the same decision about our Easter celebrations. Although we will not be able to gather in person, we will be able to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead through our live-streamed worship service. These changes, though necessary and disappointing, are a far cry from canceling Easter.

But what does it mean to celebrate the empty tomb in an empty sanctuary? I am reminded of what the young man, dressed in a white robe, said to the women at the tomb: "He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of them to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." (Mark 16:6-7)

Thom Shuman, a Presbyterian pastor and poet, posted this on Facebook. His message hit close to home as I try to figure out how to plan Easter worship in the midst of the coronavirus pandemic. He wrote:

I imagine a lot of clergy, isolating at home, pacing back and forth, spending a lot of time online, wondering how in the world they might come up with the most important Easter sermon they have ever given in their lives, especially since it will all be online, no one with them, no one in front of them, no one to look at to see how they are doing. The pressure is on!! It will continue to mount . . . what shall we do? How about this?
The camera opens on the pastor, simply sitting in a chair, in a pew, on

the steps, on the floor. Nearby, is a pile of folded clothes.

As the camera pans in, the pastor looks up from the book they are reading, stares directly into the camera, and he says, "oh, it's you." then, pointing to the clothes, she says,

"sorry, Jesus is not here; just like he told you."

then looking directly into the camera, they say,

'he's out there:

with you, your family, your neighbors;

he's out there:

in the midst of this pandemic, in the middle of all the fears:

he's out there:

home-schooling kids,

caring for folks in retirement

communities

and the vulnerable in residential settings:

he's out there:

making masks and ventilators,

building field hospitals,

working on a vaccine;

he's out there:

stocking the grocery stores,

delivering packages,

listening to folks on the hotlines;

he is not here.

he's out there,

just like he told you;

why are you looking for him here, and not out there with him?"

And then they turn back to their books as the camera pulls back from them, and pans to a shot of the doors

leading into the world.

PRESIDENT TRUMP'S CORONAVIRUS GUIDELINES FOR AMERICA

SLOW THE SPREAD

Listen and follow the directions of your STATE AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES

IF YOU FEEL SICK, stay home. Do not go to work.

IF YOUR CHILDREN ARE SICK, keep them at home. Contact your medical provider.

IF YOU ARE AN OLDER PERSON, or have a serious underling health condtion, stay home and away from other people.

If someone in your household has **TESTED POSITIVE**, keep the entire houshold at home.

Work or study **FROM HOME** whenever possible.

AVOID SOCIAL GATHERINGS in groups of more than 10 people.

Avoid eating or drinking at bars and restaurants--USE PICKUP OR DELIVERY OPTIONS.

AVOID DISCRETIONARY TRAVEL, shipping trips, and social visits.

DO NOT VISIT nursing homes or retirement or long-term care facilities unless to provide critical assistance.

ALWAYS PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE:

- * Wash your hands, especially after touching any frequently used item or surface.
- * Avoid touching your face.
- * Sneeze or cough into a tissue, or the inside of your elbow.
- * Disinfect frequently used items and surfaces as much as possible.
- * Even if you are young, or otherwise healthy, you are at risk and your activities can increase the risk for others. It is critical that you do your part to slow the spread of the Coronavirus.

At the Tuesday, March 31, 2020 stated session meeting, the elders and minister met via Zoom teleconference call and:

- * were led in an opening devotion and prayer by Elder Christy Johnson;
- * conducted the meeting as a worship service;
- * studied God's Word in Mark 4:35-41 and talked about how we heard the story of Jesus stilling the storm in light of the unusual circumstances due to the coronavirus pandemic;
- * approved the minutes from the February 18, 2020 stated session meeting;
- * approved a request from Jennie Lee Wells and Gus Aretakis to use the sanctuary for their wedding on Friday, June 5, 2020 at 5:30 p.m.;
- * heard a report from Rev. Philip Gladden about the March 7, 2020 meeting of the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina;
- * approved a recommendation from the Building & Grounds Ministry Team to repair three sets of sanctuary doors for a cost of \$3,300;
- * made the following plans for April in light of restrictions due to the coronavirus pandemic:
 - * continue to live stream worship services on Sunday morning and Good Friday, April 10
 - * celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper "virtually" on Sunday, April 5, 2020 and Friday, April 10, 2020. Dr. Phil will administer the sacrament with the invitation, words of institution, and prayers from the sanctuary. Viewers are asked to have bread and juice ready at home to participate.
 - * no church programs (except the Helping Hands Food Pantry) will be held in the building;
 - * church office hours will remain the same. Church Secretary Cheryl Brinkley will be in the church office;
- * were led in a closing prayer by Elder Dan Robinson.
