

Dear Friends,

The apostle Paul opens his second letter to the Christians at Corinth with these words: "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all consolation, who consoles us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to console those who are in any affliction with the consolation with which we ourselves are consoled by God." (2 Corinthians 1:3-4)

When we were visiting my mom at her assisted living facility on the last Sunday of July, my cousin told me a pastor was in the great room, asking about celebrating communion with my mom and her family. He is a Methodist lay minister whose church takes communion to Gracemont each Sunday morning. He told me my mom was a regular attendee (she has talked to me about this many times). When I told him how many people might be in the room, he counted the cups and realized that meant the two women already in the great room wouldn't be able to have communion. Those two friends of my mom told me, "That's all right. This is our service to Sue." About ten of us gathered in my mom's room and shared the bread and cup. It was quite an ecumenical group — Presbyterian (U.S.A.), Presbyterian Church in America, United Methodist, Roman Catholic,

and Southern Baptist!

One of my nieces lives three miles from Gracemont. Members of her small group at her church provided supper for my entire family on Saturday night at Emily's house and lunch on Sunday at Gracemont. That simple act of caring and love meant much to all of us, as well as the best wishes from these fellow Christians.

As I joined my family for communion and around the tables for supper and lunch, I thought about the many outreach ministries our congregation provides for our members. It was a different experience, being on the receiving end of communion at the bed of my mom. I thought of the many time our elders and I have visited church members in their homes, rest homes. and hospitals to extend the communion and fellowship of our congregation to them and their families. As I ate, I thought of the many meals so many of you have provided for families who are in town during difficult times.

What I'm trying to say is, I am so very grateful for your ministry of consolation to our church members, friends, and community. It is always an honor to be with you in times of joy and sorrow. It is also a blessing to share the ministry of consolation with so many caring people in our congregation. Thank you!

Monday, August 5 1:00 p.m. Monday, August 19 6:00 p.m.







- \* **We will receive** the first Feed Our Hungry Children/Backpack Ministry Offering of the 2019-2020 school year on Sunday, August 25.




