

## Prayer for Students as They Go Back to School.....

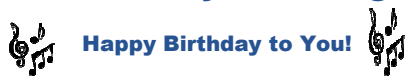

Dear Friends,

In Psalm 46:1-3 we read, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult." It sounds as if the psalmist could have been living in Southeastern North Carolina during hurricane season when he wrote these words! The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) has predicted above-average hurricane activity this season for the seventh year in a row. With 70% confidence, the administration predicts between 14-21 named storms, of which 6-10 could become hurricanes, with 3-6 forming into major hurricanes.

We are quickly approaching the fourth anniversary of Hurricane Florence and the twenty-third anniversary of Hurricane Floyd. Both storms wreaked havoc in our county, communities, and congregation. While we hope and pray that all storms will stay offshore this season, we know we might well experience the waters roaring and foaming, the winds howling and blowing, and the rains pounding and drenching.

U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gina M. Raimondo has said, "Early preparation and understanding your risk is key to being hurricane resilient and climate-ready." In the aftermath of Hurricane Florence, concerned citizens formed the Disaster Recovery Group of Duplin County, a long term recovery group that is incorporated with the State of North Carolina and established with the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. This LTRG continues to assist citizens of Duplin County whose houses sustained devastating damage during Hurricane Florence. Thanks to the unwavering and generous support of many organizations, many outside of Duplin County, the LTRG has been able to develop a wide network of relief and support services in the aftermath of any and all disasters.

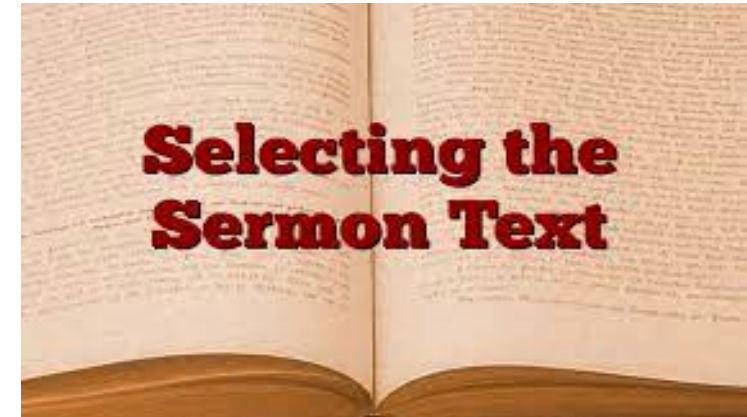
On Saturday, August 13, the Disaster Recovery Group of Duplin County will host a Disaster Preparedness Expo at The Campbell Center on Railroad Street in Wallace. The event will run from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. Almost twenty organizations (ranging from the North Carolina Insurance Commission to Pet Friends of Duplin County) have registered to have booths set up and to share preparedness and recovery materials. The Salvation Army is providing a hot dog lunch.

There's an old joke about a man stranded during a flood who refused any and all offers of aid with the refrain, "The Lord will provide!" When he finally succumbed to the floodwaters and met his Maker, he asked, "Lord, why didn't you provide?" to which God asked in return, "Who do you think sent the rescue squad, the boats, and the helicopter?" 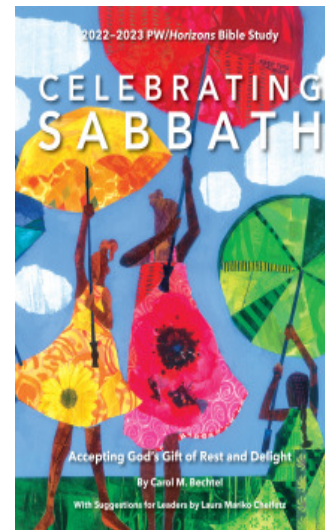

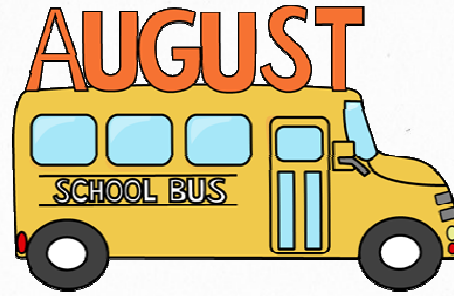
- as a celebration, not a day of dreary formality
