The Affirmation of Faith: The Nicene Creed (Ecumenical Version) We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. *Through him all things were made. The Nicene Creed is the creed or profession of faith that is most widely used in Christian liturgy. It is called "Nicene" because, in its original form, it was adopted in the city of Nicaea by the first ecumenical council which met there in 325 A.D. to counter a widening rift within the church, due to the many heresies of the time.

A creed reflecting the position of Alexander and Athanasius was written and signed by a majority of the bishops at the Council of Nicaea. However, the two parties continued to disagree with one another. In 381 A.D., a second council met in Constantinople and adopted a revised and expanded form of the 325 A.D. creed.

The Nicene Creed is a concise summary of the core beliefs of Christianity and is primarily concerned with defining the nature of the three persons of the Trinity — God, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. The council affirmed that the divinity of Christ, the Son, is of the same substance as the divinity of God, the Father. To hold otherwise, they said, was to open the possibility of many gods, and to imply that knowledge of God in Christ was not final knowledge of God.


