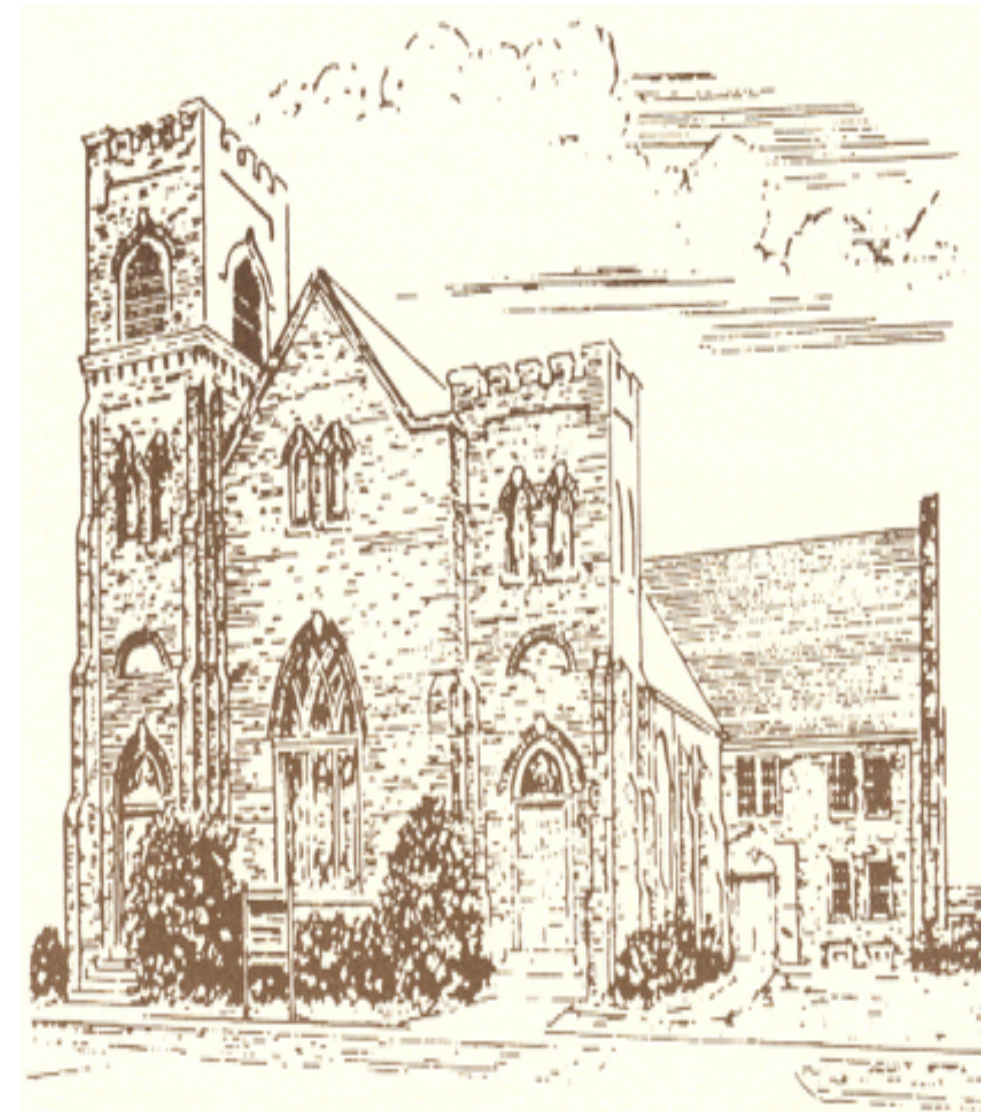
**SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 23,**
