Prayer of Confession

You call us to trust your promises and to marvel at the power of your love. Yet it's not easy to accept your promise that everything old has passed away. It's hard to live by faith. Forgive us, O God, make us new, and help us live by faith, not by sight; through Jesus Christ, our Savior. **Amen.***

Responsive Assurance of Pardon
