

Dear Friends,

At our November 26 hymn sing, Karla called our attention to the "Theological Vision Statement" in the back of our hymnal, Glory to God. The opening sentences of that statement confirm, "Collections of hymns, psalms, and spiritual songs give voice to the church's core beliefs and theological convictions. Their texts are 'compact theology. . ." Karla said how much she likes that phrase, "compact theology," and I agree.

One thing I miss at Christmas now is receiving our yearly letter from one of our seminary professors, Dr. John Leith. Dr. Leith had the reputation of being kind of cranky and crusty. He was known as an eminent Reformed theologian. But Dr. Leith had a pastor's heart and a great love for the people in Christ's church. I looked forward to getting his Christmas letter because he always wrote about his favorite Christmas carols and hymns. This esteemed theologian shared the Christmas message through the words of the Christmas carols his mother sand to him when he was a child.

Over the years, many people have said to me, "Well, I'm no theologian, but . . ." My response has always been, "Do you think about God? Do you have a relationship with God? Then you're a theologian!" Reading theology can seem daunting, but our Christmas hymns are wonderful

examples of compact theology. John 1:1 says, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was God." We can dissect the meaning of that theological statement, but most of the time such good news simply moves us to express our joy, admiration, and gratitude for God's great gift of Christmas.

This Christmas, why not read some theology? As you prepare for worship or have your daily devotion or sit in the pew before a worship service. look at the words of some of your favorite Christmas carols and think about the good news they proclaim and the mystery they reveal. When you join your fellow believers in the carols in worship during Advent and Christmas, consider the "compact theology" of the songs that tell about a child in a manger. shepherds in the field, a star in the east, wise men traveling from afar, and a silent, holy night. Each carol, in its own way, is sharing the good news of Christmas: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." (John 3:16)

We smile at the ingenious ways children wriggle out of unpleasantness. It's not so amusing when we adults avoid facing life challenges and dilemmas. We try to invent a new rule. We embellish the truth. We find a self-serving shortcut. We accidentally-on-purpose forget a commitment. We don't want to lose.

It is hard for us to confront our difficulties head on. We do what we can to avoid hurdles. It seems easier to sidestep problems than it is to tackle them. We try to pass off responsibilities to others instead of plunging into them. We may postpone facing our concerns instead of coming to grips with them.

Yet, all that is necessary is to focus on one problem at a time and explore how to resolve it.




