Dear Friends,

I saw this graffiti on FaceBook in November: "It's way too early for Christmas music – anonymous, 75 B.C." When you start hearing Christmas music in department stores at the first of November, by the time Christmas rolls around near the end of December, it might seem like you've been hearing it for seventy-five years!

One of the challenges of planning worship during Advent is deciding which hymns to sing. I recently read an article that laid out two extreme options: start singing all of the Christmas carols on the first Sunday in Advent, even if that Sunday is still in November OR put off singing any Christmas carols until the Christmas Eve service and the couple of Sundays between Christmas Day and Epiphany on January 6.

The article did identify a third approach: begin Advent with Advent hymns, then mix in more and more Christmas carols as the Sundays of Advent progress. That's the process I use. It's not hard to distinguish between the two types of hymns. Advent hymns typically sound more melancholy, while Christmas carols tend to sound more upbeat and joyful. Maybe that's why folks prefer to sing Christmas carols throughout Advent.

However, if we ignore the music of Advent, we miss a big part of the Advent message. The Advent tunes nicely complement the Advent lyrics, which are primarily based on Old Testament themes of longing, hope, anticipation, and waiting for deliverance.

Advent helps us remember the "first Advent (coming)" of Jesus at Christmas. Advent also points us forward to the "second Advent" of Christ. Just as God's people expectantly waited for a deliverer, so we expectantly wait for Christ's return, which will herald God's completion of his purposes for all of creation.

In the meantime, we live in the inbetween time. In a sense, every day all year round is like Advent: remembering and giving thanks for Jesus coming among us in the flesh and anticipating with hope his glorious return. In the meantime, we are called to live faithful lives, serving God and our neighbors.

Don't worry! We'll sing plenty of Christmas carols in December. But, when we do sing Advent hymns in worship, I encourage you to pay attention to the words and their meaning for your life and mine in this in-between time.

May you have a blessed Advent and a very Merry Christmas!

Our lives are hectic and complex, especially during the holidays. Demands and expectations of everyday life create a certain amount of stress, but when an unexpected event or tragedy occurs, our stress levels increase dramatically.

In order to cope, we must first recognize stress, and then find ways to reduce or manage it. There are numerous signs and signals we get when we are overly stressed. Not paying attention to the symptoms can result in serious damage to ourselves both physically and emotionally and to our relationships.

Tense muscles, clenched teeth, sexual difficulties, insomnia, headaches, stomach aches, and fatigue are some of the physiological indicators of stress. Certain behaviors can also be indications of non-controlled stress. They can include under- or over-eating, increased smoking and alcohol consumption, prescription and nonprescription drug use or abuse, pacing, emotional outburst, excessive absences or tardiness. Procrastination and lack of ability to concentrate may also be stress related.

A healthy lifestyle is important in managing stress, there are times when proper diet, rest and exercise are not enough. Sometimes major life changes are required to gain control of the stress. Can your stress level be managed with some simple adjustments? Or do you need to make major changes for your life in order?
