#### Dear Friends,

I recently purchased a copy of The Jefferson Bible from the Smithsonian Institution. This Bible was compiled by Thomas Jefferson while he was President. It contains clippings from Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John that Jefferson himself cut from Greek, Latin, French, and English language Bibles. Jefferson entitled his book "The Life and Morals of Jesus of Nazareth Extracted textually from the Gospels in Greek, Latin, French & English." True to his Enlightenment ideals and devotion to human reason, Jefferson excluded all stories of the miraculous that could not be supported through reason.

Jefferson's original idea was to write "The Philosophy of Jesus," but eventually expanded his work to include biographical information about Jesus that he deemed reliable. Jefferson's "Life and Morals of Jesus of Nazareth" begins with what we call the Christmas story in Luke 2. However, he skips from Luke 2:1-7 (the story about Joseph and Mary traveling to Bethlehem) to Luke 2:21 (the story of Jesus getting circumcised in the temple eight days later). Jefferson cut the following stories from Luke 2: the angel's announcement to the shepherds; Simeon's song of blessing and thanksgiving in the temple; Anna's praise of God in the temple when she saw Jesus; and Luke 2:49-50, when the twelve-year-old Jesus asks his parents, "Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" Jefferson ended his entire "Life and Morals of Jesus of Nazareth" with this compilation of two verses: "There laid they Jesus and rolled a great stone to the door of the sepulchre, and departed."

Our Christmas celebration would be sadly lacking if I were to preach on Christmas Eve from Thomas Jefferson's "The Life and Morals of Jesus of Nazareth." If I did, we might all be inspired by the life and sayings of a great teacher who died a noble death. However, history (past and contemporary) is full of great and inspiring teachers and leaders who died noble deaths for their causes. What we need to hear again this Christmas is the angel's message to the shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night: "Do not be afraid; for see — I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." The angel's opening words — "Do not be afraid" — are a typical

Thank you for participating in this wonderful ministry and sharing the love of Christ with others. Thank you for your support of our Outreach Committee.


To participate by buying a gift:
