Our Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) *Book of Order* directs that, “The church nurtures those baptized as children and calls them to make public their personal profession of faith and their acceptance of responsibility in the life of the church. . . After the session has received them as active members they shall be presented to the congregation during a service of public worship. In that service the church shall confirm them in their baptismal identity. They are commissioned for full participation in the mission and governance of the church, and are welcomed by the congregation.”



Dear Friends,

In his second letter to his young protege, Timothy, the apostle Paul wrote, "I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you . . . But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus." (2 Timothy 1:5; 3:14-15)

This month thirteen young people in our congregation will continue their journey of faith as they begin Confirmation 2015. When a child is baptized in a Presbyterian congregation, the parents and members make promises to raise him/her to know and love Jesus Christ. We also express the hope and prayer that one day the child being baptized will make a public and personal profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Confirmation means the congregation confirms young people in their baptismal identity as a child of God who has been marked as Christ's own by

the Holy Spirit. Confirmation is not an endpoint, but an important part of the ongoing life journey in the faith.

Our young people will explore what it means to be followers of Jesus Christ and to live out their faith in what God is calling them to do. They will work with elders and other members of our congregation who, along with me and Elder Regina Simpson, will serve as mentors and covenant partners.

The session has set Sunday, May 17 as Confirmation Sunday. That will be a very special day in the life of our congregation. Our youth will lead worship that day, our high school seniors will be recognized and celebrated, and our confirmands will be confirmed in their baptismal identity.

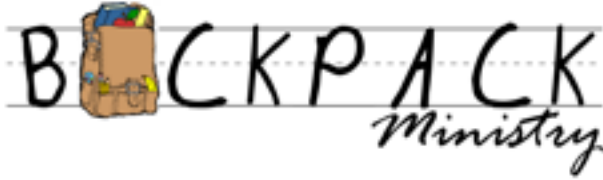
ACTIONS OF THE SESSION

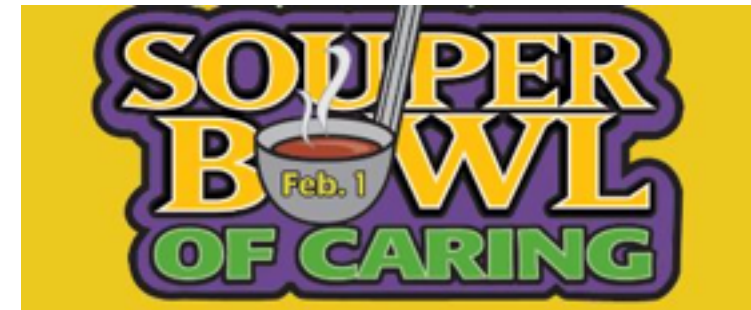

PREACHING AND WORSHIP LEADERSHIP IN FEBRUARY



**FOCUS ON
THE BIG MESSAGE**



Pastors, churches, and our Presbytery all face important decisions about how to vote on the General Assembly’s actions regarding same-gender marriage. Before we debate and vote on the proposed amendments on March 7, our Presbytery wants to encourage a time of discernment through “holy conversations” – conversations which intentionally make room for the Holy Spirit. Two pastors, Jim Randall (MacPherson PC/Fayetteville) and Ernie Thompson (First PC/Wilmington), have been asked to share their perspectives on same-gender marriage in the church and engage in such a holy conversation at three locations in the Presbytery. At these gatherings there will also be a time for questions and small group discussion.

These Holy Conversations gatherings will be conversational but not a debate, time for debate will be at the stated meeting on Saturday, March 7, in Elizabethtown. All voting commissioners to the Presbytery are encouraged to attend:

1. The ruling elder commissioner elected by the session of your church to attend the March Presbytery meeting;
2. All Pastors and Commissioned Ruling Elders (lay pastors), especially those who plan to attend the March 7 meeting;
3. All other voting members of presbytery;
4. Other interested church leaders and members who want to explore this subject.
