Dear Friends,

One day, I texted Vera on my iPhone and asked if she would change the cloths on the pulpit and lectern. The cloths are also called “paraments.” After I hit “Send,” I looked at the message and realized the autocorrect function had kicked in. So, I actually asked Vera to change the “pulpit parrots”! She wanted to know what color parrots I wanted in the sanctuary!

We use purple, white, green, and red paraments in our church (and my and the choir’s matching stoles) to symbolize the different seasons of the Church year. Purple appears during Advent and Lent. White shows up at Christmas and Easter, and also for weddings and funerals. Red is the least used color, on the Day of Pentecost. Green is the most commonly used color in about 65% of the Church year. That season on the Church calendar is called “Ordinary Time.”

The “Directory for Worship” of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) says, “God has provided a rhythm of seasons which orders life and influences the church’s worship. God’s work of redemption in Jesus Christ offers the Church a central pattern for ordering worship in relationship to significant occasions in the life of Jesus and of the people of God. Human life in community reflects a variety of rhythms that also affect Christian worship. Among these are the annual cycles of civic, agricultural, school and business life; special

times of family remembrance and celebration; and the patterns of a variety of cultural expressions, commemorations and events. The church in carrying out its mission also creates a cycle of activities, programs and observances.”

Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us that “for everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven.” We mark the times of our lives with clocks, watches, calendars, anniversaries, and customary celebrations, even in the church. The passage of time and its apparent repetition of events lulls us into thinking “there is nothing new under the sun.”

Even in this green Ordinary Time in February, we believe God has done and continues to do extraordinary things in our midst in the person of Jesus Christ. That’s the good news of the gospel, as John puts it in the introduction to his gospel: “The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood.” (The Message) God chooses what is ordinary to do his extraordinary work. That includes you and me. As ordinary as we are, as ordinary as our lives may appear to be, we are claimed by God and called God’s children to do his extra-ordinary work.

As we make our way toward the purple Season of Lent (begins March 1), let us remember that God’s Son, our Savior, lived an ordinary life, just like each of us. But he lived it in an extraordinary way, loving God with his whole being and loving us, even to the point of dying for our sins.



Rev. Jerry Bron will be our guest preacher on February 5 and 12. For us to get to know him better, here is a short bio about him:

Gezinus “Jerry” Dirk Bron was born in the Netherlands on December of 1945. He is the oldest of five children. He emigrated to the US in 1955. Grew up in the Castle Hayne-Wrightsboro section of New Hanover County, NC. Played basketball at New Hanover High and UNC -W. Graduated from UNC-W with a BA in history in 1968 and Union Seminary in 1972 with a Master of Divinity and a Doctor of Ministry in 1982. Pastored three churches over the next 38 years: Pink Hill Presbyterian Church, Pink Hill, NC from 72-78, First Presbyterian in Washington, NC from 1978 to 1993, and then as organizing pastor of the Southminster Church in Gastonia, NC. from 1993 to 2010. All three churches experienced significant growth in various ways while he was pastor there. Jerry has been married to Linda McKoy since 1968. She is a 1969 grad of VCU in Richmond, Va. She taught public school elementary grades and AIG for 33 years. Linda and Jerry are parents to Allison, Elizabeth and Jakob. Seven grandchildren call him Opa. He retired in 2010 and now lives on the Wrightsville Beach side of Wilmington. He still serves the church as a supply preacher and an occasional part time interim. He is a coach to new church developments and new church pastors. He specializes in helping start new churches.
