Dear Friends.

You will remember that we get our name "Presbyterian" from the Greek word presbuteros which means "elder." We are Presbyterian because we are governed by elders in our church. Ministers of the Word and Sacrament are called "Teaching Elders." Members of the congregation who are elected by you to be our spiritual leaders are called "Ruling Elders." Here's how our Book of Order describes the reason why we are led by Ruling Elders and some of the responsibilities of our spiritual leaders: "As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they 'lord it over' the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with ministers of the Word and Sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships."

On Sunday, January 15, the session will ordain and install Sandy Cobb, Debbie Price, and Blake Wallace as Ruling Elders in the Class of 2025. They will join me and Hayes Ludlum, Greg Maready, Kelli Norris, Joyce Ange, Danielle Sills, and Curt Simpson to serve as your session in the coming year. You are to be commended for your wise selection of Sandy, Debbie, and Blake as our newest elders, as well as the men and women who continue to serve on the session. I am grateful for all of the men and women in our congregation who discern God's call in their hearts and lives and are willing to serve as Ruling Elders. Remember, Ruling Elders are charged to be spiritual leaders alongside me as the pastor. This partnership is important, invigorating, and necessary for the ongoing mission and ministry of our congregation.



At the Tuesday, December 20, 2022 session meeting, the elders and minister:

- * were trained in serving communion by Elder Harriet Farrior;
- * conducted the meeting as a worship service;
- * were led in an opening devotion and prayer by Elder Fred Burroughs;
- * read God's Word in Luke 2:1-20 and Matthew 2:1-23 and talked about our favorite Christmas carols:

- * established the Sunday morning schedule (worship only at 11:00 a.m.) for New Year's Day, January 1, 2023;
- * prayed for members of the congregation and community;
- * were led in a closing prayer by Elder Fred Burroughs.

PRESBYTERY COMMISSION TO MEET AT WPC




The Commission on Ministry of the East Community of the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina will meet on Thursday, January 5 at 12:30 p.m. in Room 304. The Commission on Ministry is comprised of fifteen ruling elders and teaching elders. The commission's duties include the reception and oversight of ministers of the Word and Sacrament, approval of calls for pastoral services, oversight of congregations without pastoral leadership, dissolution of relationships, and dismissal of members. Rev. Philip Gladden is a member of the COM.



THE DAY OF EPIPHANY Friday, January 6

The word "epiphany" (from the Greek epiphaneia or theophaneia) means "appearance" or "manifestation" of God, and has roots in the word for sunrise or dawn. In ancient times, an epiphany meant either a visible manifestation of a god or the solemn visit of a ruler venerated as a god.



For Christians, Christmas marks the coming of God to us; Epiphany celebrates the appearance of the Lord in the midst of humanity. The Christmas stories of the birth of Immanuel declare the divine entry; Epiphany extols the revelation of God to the world in the person of Jesus of Nazareth.

In our celebrations of Christmas and Epiphany we rejoice in the dawning and the arising of Light in darkness. ... Epiphany not only discloses the Savior to the world but also calls the world to show forth Christ, to be witnesses to God's true Light. The timeless mystery of the incarnation, God in flesh, leads us forth to show and tell of Christ as God's gift of grace and salvation for all persons. Some call this ongoing epiphany the work of Christmas.
