Dear Friends,

The July/August 2015 issue of Reader's Digest has an article called "15 Astonishing Facts About America." Number 14 is "Our real Independence Day – the day Congress voted us free from British rule – is July 2, 1776. July 4 is just when John Hancock put the first signature on the Declaration of Independence to spread the word."

You may know that John Hancock's signature was the first – and largest – to be added to the Declaration of Independence (thus our saying, "Put your John Hancock here."). He was the president of the Continental Congress. Legend has it that Hancock signed his name in large letters so King George III could read it without his glasses. However, scholars have determined that Hancock always signed his name in large letters.

Did you know that a Presbyterian minister also signed the Declaration of Independence? John Witherspoon served as the president of the College of New Jersey (later known as Princeton University). He was a delegate to the Continental

and was twice elected to the New Jersey legislature. One article about Rev. Witherspoon noted that he was very active in the Continental Congress, serving on more than one hundred committees and frequently debating on the floor of Congress (doesn't that sound just like a Presbyterian?).

Rev. Witherspoon was elected to the Continental Congress in 1776 in time to vote for the Declaration of Independence. In response to a fellow member of Congress who argued that the country was "not yet ripe" for such a declaration, the Presbyterian minister replied that the country "was not only ripe for the measure, but in danger of rotting for the want of it." People frequently note how similar our Presbyterian form of government is to our Federal form of government. In many ways, it's the other way around. Presbyterians played an important role in the founding and fashioning of our country and form of government. As you celebrate this 4th of July, pause to think about our Presbyterian ancestors who risked much to help establish and protect the freedoms we enjoy today as people of faith. Happy 4th of July!


