Dear Friends,

Recently I had to sign the 2020 session minutes for review by the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina. When I signed the minutes of the March 15, 2020 called meeting, I was flooded with memories. That was five days after I had my shoulder replacement surgery. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we had already canceled worship for that day. The elders and I were joined by other leaders in the congregation to discuss worship plans and the use of the building in the following weeks.

Little did any of us know that Sunday afternoon that we would be making decisions throughout the rest of 2020 and into 2021. I distinctly remember thinking that, at the latest, things might be "back to normal" by the end of May 2020. As time went on, I began to imagine a Sunday in the early fall 2020 when everyone could return to worship safely and we could celebrate with a delicious and bountiful covered dish luncheon after worship.

Fourteen months later, your elders and I are still having to make decisions concerning in person worship and other programs and ministries within the bounds of the safety protocols. Please know that the men and women you have elected as Ruling Elders have served and are serving you faithfully, diligently, seriously, and prayerfully. Every decision made concerning worship and other programs has been made with the health and safety of our congregation as a top priority. At the same time, the session has worked hard to utilize many methods to maintain contact with the congregation and provide meaningful worship and Christian Education opportunities.

Elsewhere in this newsletter, you can read about the latest decisions the session has made upon recommendations from the Worship & Music Ministry Team and the Christian Education Ministry Team. These decisions are based on the needs of our congregation, health and safety protocols from the CDC and the World Health Organization, and advice from the elders regarding how their businesses and occupations are handling the COVID-19 situation presently. As we move ahead, it is important that we be open to the movement, inspiration,

ACTIONS OF THE SESSION

At the Tuesday, April 13, 2021 stated session meeting, the elders and minister:

- * were led in an opening devotion and prayer by Elder Hayes Ludlum;
- * conducted the meeting as a worship service;
- * studied God's Word in Mark 6:30-44 and discussed an article "When We Get to 'Not Enough' Places of inadequacy challenge us to look to God"
- * approved the minutes of the March 16, 2021 stated session meeting;
- * approved these recommendations from the Worship & Music Ministry Team:
- 1. That the crib nursery (0 2 years) be made available during 11:00 a.m. worship beginning Sunday, May 2
- 2. That the children in the sanctuary come forward for the children's sermon and be seated on the floor in designated, socially distanced spots
- 3. That activity bags be made available for children in the sanctuary to use during worship
- 4. That Children's Church (3 6 years) resume in the fall to coincide with the start-up of Sunday School classes.
- * asked the Worship & Music Ministry Team to make recommendations for changes in in person worship in light of more people being willing to attend;
- * approved a recommendation from the Worship & Music Ministry Team that the chancel choir be allowed to rehearse in the choir room on Wednesday nights and record in the sanctuary as they have music ready. Handbells can continue as an ensemble or move toward the complete handbell choir participating, rehearsing on Sunday mornings.
- * approved recommendations from the Christian Education Ministry Team:

Sunday School: We will continue with virtual Sunday School offerings through the summer. This will allow us the opportunity to survey our congregation to determine needs and areas of study that may be of interest, as well as an opportunity to line up teachers and really promote our Sunday School offerings. Please feel free to share any suggestions or ideas.

Youth Sunday: We are working with the seniors this year to determine a plan for Youth Sunday which will be May 16, 2021. We are excited about celebrating these young adults.

The Presbytery of Coastal Carolina 121st Stated Meeting Monday, May 17, 2021





IN-PERSON WORSHIP GUIDELINES UPDATED EFFECTIVE SUNDAY, MAY 2

At a called meeting on April 27, on recommendation from the Worship & Music Ministry Team, the session approved the following changes/plans for in person worship, effective Sunday, May 2:

- 1. That pre-registration for in person worship be discontinued.
- 2. That temperature checks at the doors be discontinued.
- 3. That mask wearing in the sanctuary continue to be required.
- 4. That the current offering collection process (plates at each entrance; mailing to church; online giving; drop in mail slot of church office building) be continued.
- 5. That the current method of celebrating the Lord's Supper (individual, pre-packaged communion sets) be continued.
- 6. That Friendship pads not be passed in the pews.
- 7. That hymnbooks, Bibles, and pew cushions be returned to the pews. (Pews are sanitized after each worship service and we have one week between worship services. People who do not wish to handle hymnbooks and Bibles can use the liturgy on the screen in the sanctuary.)
- 8. That worshipers continue to enter the sanctuary through the east vestibule door or the portico door.
- 9. That two ushers be on duty and also act as greeters. Ushers will help people find seats.
- 10. That worshipers be encouraged to maintain social distancing while in the sanctuary.
- 11. That arrangements be made to document attendance for contact tracing purposes.

The following recommendations had already been approved:

- 1. That the crib nursery (0-2 years) be made available during 11:00 a.m. worship beginning May 2, 2021.
- 2. That the children in the sanctuary come forward for the children's sermon and be seated on the floor in designated, socially distanced spots.
- 3. That activity bags be made available for children in the sanctuary to use during worship.
- 4. That Children's Church (3-6 years old) resume in the fall to coincide with the start-up of Sunday School classes.
- 5. That choir rehearsals resume in person on Wednesday nights in the Music Room. The choir will observe COVID-19 protocols. The Handbell Ensemble will practice at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday mornings.
