Dear Friends.

The session invites you to join us on Sunday, November 3 following worship for a covered dish luncheon and Stewardship program. This will be a time of fellowship and thanksgiving. The Ministry Teams of the session will update us on the ministries of our congregation and the opportunities before us in 2020. You will have the chance to ask questions and join in the discussion as we continue to discern God's will for our congregation's ministry.

On November 8, 1884, the Duplin Roads Presbyterian Church was formally organized by members of the Rockfish Presbyterian Church. The original church building was a white frame structure, located on the old Wilmington-Raleigh stage road. The Wallace Presbyterian Church still stands in the same location, one hundred thirty-five years later.

In the history written for the centennial celebration in November 1984, you read, "The walls were built because the people had a mind to work. The old men dreamed dreams and so they came to encourage the workers. When the church was finished all the members were so proud of the new building one of the grand old men said, 'Now children, we are proud of our church, but we must be careful that we do not worship the building instead of the God who has made it possible."

In 1913, the white frame structure was replaced by the brick sanctuary building we still use for worship. The session minutes recorded, "First Sunday, January 5, 1913, as previously announced, services were held in the New Church, with a congregation that

filled the house. This date being just five years since the building was commenced."

In the depths of the Great Depression, members recognized the need for Sunday School classrooms, so a pay-as-you-go building program was begun. On March 31, 1940, the Currie Building was dedicated, almost ten years after the work had begun. You can read the names of the faithful members of the building committee on the plaque in the Currie Building.

In 2015, we dedicated our "new" building (which will soon be fifteen years old!) that provided much needed space for Christian Education classes, our music program, and the church office. As a result, we have been able to provide office space for two members of the presbytery's staff. The mortgage note was burned after approximately three and a half years.

The church is not the building. The church is the people. But the people of the church use the church building as an important tool for engaging in the mission and ministry which God has put before us and placed on our hearts. Our church building suffered some heavy damage due to Hurricane Florence. Our church family suffered some significant losses as beloved members relocated. However, the session has affirmed that our mission priorities have not changed, despite the changing circumstances since Fall 2018.

Please join us on November 3 as we celebrate God's gracious gifts, give thanks for the generosity and vision of people who have gone before us at WPC, and hear about the mission and ministry opportunities ahead of us as a congregation in 2020 and beyond.




### **CHARITY REBUILD CENTER**
