Dear Friends,

In 1971, Jesuit priest Mark Link published a book called He is the Still Point of the Turning World. According to the Amazon blurb, the book is "a compilation of articles, poems, excerpts from books, scripture quotations, and vivid photographs explaining why God through Jesus Christ is the ultimate reality of human existence."

I have kept my copy of He is the Still Point for almost fifty years. When you flip through it, you can definitely tell it is a product of the 1970's (and it only cost \$3.90)! As a teenager I read through the book again and again and found both inspiration and challenges as someone who wanted to follow Jesus Christ.

As I looked through the book recently, I noticed I had circled a poem called "Night Traveller." Fifty years later it seems eerily appropriate for the times in which we live:

Man: I travel an unknown land to an unknown city. The road is dark and misty. Soaring mountains and roaring winds and waters block my path. I fear!

Jesus: Fear not. I'll light your way, move mountains from your path, walk with you on waters and teach you how to laugh.

The past nine months have certainly felt like we have been traveling an unknown land to an unknown city, on a dark and misty road, with soaring mountains and roaring winds in our way. Need I say that life is not the same? And who knows what life is going to be like in the coming months and years?

As much as I like the contents of the book I have kept for fifty years, I have always been captivated by the title. It reminds me of the assuring words in Hebrews 13:8: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." That is the hope we can cling to in the middle of this turning world that feels like it is spiraling out of control.

Know that I share your sense of loss and your questions in these trying times. I, too, wonder what the future holds, for our church, for our community, for our country, for life as we used to know it.

### **ACTIONS OF THE SESSION**

At the Tuesday, October 20, 2020 meeting of the session, the elders and minister:

- \* met via Zoom teleconference;
- \* conducted the meeting as a worship service;
- \* read the Word of God in 2 Corinthians 8:1-15 and discussed an article "Stewardship in a Pandemic":
- \*received a report from Elder Lindsay Skidmore about the virtual stated meeting of the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina on October 3, 2020;
- \* at her request, received Regina Parker's renunciation of the jurisdiction of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and removed her name from the membership roll and as a Ruling Elder;
- \* approved the minutes of the September 15, 2020 stated session meeting;
- \* called congregational meetings for Sunday, November 1, 2020 for the purpose of electing the 2020 Nominating Committee and Sunday, December 6, 2020 for the purpose of hearing a report from the 2020 Nominating Committee, electing three Ruling Elders to the Class of 2023, presenting the 2021 budget as information, and holding the annual meeting of the corporation. The congregational meetings will be held in person and by Zoom teleconference;
- \* approved a request from the minister to use Continuing Education leave time and funds to attend Cedar Cross Retreat Center in Louisburg, NC Sunday afternoon, November 8 Wednesday, November 11 and to purchase journal subscriptions and books as funds allow;
- \* approved a recommendation from the Worship & Music Ministry Team not to have in person Advent worship services and luncheons in December, but to provide virtual worship services (either real time or pre-recorded) for the community to view;
- \* approved a recommendation from the Worship & Music Ministry Team not to have an in person Christmas Eve worship service, but to provide a virtual worship service (either real time or pre-recorded) for the congregation to view;
- \* received information from the Outreach Ministry Team about the Monday, November 9, 2020 Helping Hands Food Pantry food drive and the 2020 St. Nicholas Christmas Project;
- \* received information from the Christian Education Ministry Team about rescheduling Confirmation Class from Spring 2021 to Spring 2022 or Spring 2023, in order to have a larger group of middle school students and due to Covid-19 restrictions;
- \* approved the 2021 budget.
- \* shared prayer concerns from the congregation and community;
- \* prayed the Lord's Prayer together.

### **ADVENT 2020 BEGINS NOVEMBER 29**

The First Sunday of Advent is November 29, and thus begins the four week period leading up to our celebration of Christmas. "Advent" comes from the Latin word for "coming." In Advent, we look back to the first coming of Jesus and ahead to our Lord's second coming. Even though we are are all busy in the weeks leading up to Christmas getting ready for our celebration, Advent is more a time of preparing our hearts and lives for the coming of our Messiah. The theme words for the four Sundays of Advent — Hope, Peace, Joy, Love — remind us of the life Jesus lived, the life we are called to live, and the life in God's coming Kingdom.

Here is some information about Advent 2020 in our congregation:

### **Lighting the Advent Wreath in Worship**

Different families will lead us in the lighting of the Advent wreath each Sunday. Families will be asked to record a video from home to be shared in our live stream worship service.

### **Thursday Advent Worship Services & Luncheons**

Unfortunately, due to the increasing threat of Covid-19 and the necessary precautions to keep our community safe, the session has decided we will not have our annual Advent worship services and luncheons this year. As disappointing as this is, we will not be without Advent worship. Our worship team (Karla, Vera, Bill, and Phil) will work with the Worship & Music Ministry Team to provide weekly video services that can be viewed and shared with the community.

The hope and promise of Advent can be summed up in these words from "A Brief Statement of Faith" in our church's Book of Confessions: "In gratitude to God, empowered by the Spirit, we strive to serve Christ in our daily tasks and to live holy and joyful live, even as we watch for God's new heaven and new earth, praying, 'Come, Lord Jesus!'"
