

Dear Friends,

I remember Rev. Joe Morrison ending his meal blessings with words similar to these from the poem, "Gratefulness," by the 17th century English poet George Herbert: "Thou that hast given so much to me, Give one thing more, a grateful heart." While that is a good everyday prayer, during the Thanksgiving season it is an especially appropriate prayer. We can think about all of the things God has given us, and we can hope for and live with grateful hearts.

Nancy and I have this sign hanging on the wall where it is easy to see every morning:



However, despite the sentiments of Joe Morrison's blessings, George Herbert's poem, and the sign in our house, I don't always remember to begin each day with a grateful heart. Too many days I am more like Charlie Anderson, the Virginia farmer in the 1965 movie Shenandoah. He promised his dying wife he would raise his children to be good Christians, but Charlie's pride and bitterness got in the way of his own faith. With his family gathered around the dinner table full of home cooked food, Charlie says he reckons he ought to pray. This is his prayer: "Lord, we cleared this land. We plowed it, sowed it, and harvested it. We cooked the harvest. It wouldn't be here, we wouldn't be eatin' it if we hadn't done it all ourselves. We worked dog-bone hard for every crumb and morsel, but we thank you just the same anyway, Lord, for the food we're about to eat. Amen."

Not surprisingly, the Bible is full of thanksgiving to God and encouragement to have grateful hearts. The opening words of Psalm 107 are echoed throughout the book of Psalms: "O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever." Psalm 9:1 says, "I will give thanks to you, Lord, with all my heart; I will tell of all your wonderful deeds." And, of course, there are these words from the Old 100th: "Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations."

In like manner, the New Testament calls us to have grateful hearts because of all God has done for us in Jesus Christ. 1 Thessalonians 5:18 reads, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ

* prayed for members of the congregation and community; were led in a closing prayer by Elder Danielle Sills.

We will receive our monthly Feed Our Hungry Children/Backpack Ministry Offering on Sunday, November 27. This offering provides school lunches and weekend food for students in Duplin County Public Schools. Thank you for your generous and faithful support.

From July 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022, these schools were served: Rose Hill - Magnolia Elementary/Middle, Wallace Elementary/Middle, Chinquapin Elementary/Middle, Beulaville Elementary/Middle, and Wallace-Rose Hill High. The ministry is currently providing around 160 bags of food per week. Contributions have been received from individuals, organizations, and twelve churches. Thank you for your generous and faithful contributions. Jesus for you." In his advice to Timothy (1 Timothy 4:4-5), Paul writes, "For everything created by God is good, and nothing is to be rejected, provided it is received with thanksgiving; for it is sanctified by God's word and by prayer." Finally, Colossians 3:15 describes a good way to live, not just on the fourth Thursday of November, but every day: "And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful."

We have a lot to be thankful for, for the Lord is good and his steadfast love endures forever.




