Dear Friends,

As I write this article, I am at a continuing education seminar at Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, VA. The event is titled "Start with Good News: Rediscovering the Why of Evangelism."

The first session began with this definition of evangelism:

"Evangelism is talking about and demonstrating our relationship with God in such a way that it might resonate with others and draw them into their own relationships with God." That's quite different from trying to prove something about God by arguing with another person. Instead, evangelism is really about saying (and showing) what a difference God has made in your life and then offering the invitation, "Come and see for yourself."

You may remember the Kevin Costner movie, *Field of Dreams*. As the main character walks through a cornfield, he hears a whispering voice say, "If you build it, he will come." Many times our approach in the church is to think "if we build it (a good program, a nice building, etc.), they will come." In other words, here we are - if people want to come to us, they know where to find us.

However, Jesus didn't tell us, "If

you build it, they will come." He said, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing and teaching them." How can we meet people in our community where they are in life, share the good news of what God has done for us in Jesus Christ, and invite them to "Come and see"?

During October and November, we will talk much about the stewardship of all of life. This is the beginning of a year-round emphasis on the stewardship of life. Part of our job as stewards of God's grace is to manage the good news of Jesus Christ well and to share it with others so they may enjoy the abundant life and joy of knowing and following Jesus Christ.

We live in a complex and complicated world in which, as someone said in one of today's sessions, "Fear is the news of the day." But, he went on to say, "Fear may be the news of the day, but it is not good news. What we have to say and to share is good news!"

May God bless you as you rejoice in being a child of God and consider how God is at work in your life to share that good news. It is an honor and privilege to be your pastor.





A History of World Communion Sunday (from The Presbyterian Mission Agency website)

World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor. Davitt S. Bell (the late Clerk of Session and church historian at Shadyside) recalled that Dr. Kerr first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930). Dr. Kerr's younger son, the Rev. Dr. Donald Craig Kerr, who is pastor emeritus of the Roland Park Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, was sixteen in 1933. He has related that World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside. It was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another. When I asked Donald Kerr how the idea of World Communion Sunday spread from that first service to the world wide practice of today, this is what he replied, "The concept spread very slowly at the start. People did not give it a whole lot of thought. It was during the Second World War that the spirit caught hold, because we were trying to hold the world together. World Wide Communion symbolized the effort to hold things together, in a spiritual sense. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ." Celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936. Churches in other denominations were invited to celebrate with us from the beginning, but it wasn't until 1940 when the Department of Evangelism of the Federal Council of Churches (a predecessor body of the National Council of Churches) promoted extending the celebration to a number of churches around the world that the practice became widespread. Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating that the church founded on Jesus Christ peacefully shares God-given goods in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed.
