We will celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper on World Communion Sunday, October 6. The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. Paul tells us that we are to "discern the body" when we partake of Holy Communion, mindful that we note our relationship to all our brothers and sisters in Christ in the celebration.

World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor.

Celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936. Churches in other denominations were invited to celebrate with us from the beginning, but it wasn't until 1940 when the Department of Evangelism of the Federal Council of Churches (a predecessor body of the National Council of Churches) promoted extending the celebration to a number of churches around the world that the practice became widespread.



Dear Friends.

Many of you know that Easter Sunday is my favorite day of the year. One of my other favorite days in the church year is the first Sunday in October, World Communion Sunday. As you can read elsewhere in this newsletter, World Communion Sunday began in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh in 1933. The celebration truly became worldwide during and after World War II, as the church universal sought ways to bear witness to our unity in Christ.

Although it is true that every time we celebrate the Lord's Supper, Christians in other places are also coming to the table, we are especially aware of our connection with brothers and sisters in Christ on World Communion Sunday. On the night before he died. Jesus prayed for his disciples and us, who would believe in him through their word, "that they may be one." He prayed, "The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me." (John 17:20, 22-23)

On World Communion Sunday 2019, we have a special opportunity to strengthen our connection and unity in Christ with the church in Zambia in southern Africa. As we come to the table that day, we will also have the opportunity to bring a special offering to purchase Hebrew and Greek textbooks for the students at Justo

Mwale Theological University College in Lusaka. These men and women are studying to be pastors in Reformed and Presbyterian churches in Zambia and surrounding countries. The offering goal is \$1,100, which will pay for the books and shipping.

In July 1979, some friends in Atlanta held a going away party for me as I packed up to move to Richmond and enroll at Union Presbyterian Seminary. They presented me with two books:

New Testament Greek for Beginners by J. Gresham Machen and A Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament by Bauer, Arndt, and Gingrich. Forty years later, I still use these Greek language resources in my ministry.

When I taught at JMTUC in 2013, I noticed the students turning in their textbooks on the last day of class. When I asked Dustin Ellington why, he said the students couldn't afford to purchase their own books, nor could the school afford to provide textbooks for the students to keep. This special offering on World Communion Sunday will enhance the students' academic preparation for and practice of ministry as they graduate and serve churches. Beyond that gift, these books will be a concrete gesture of our unity in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Please join me and Christians around the world at the Lord's table on October 6. Please join me in supporting this special offering for Books for Zambia.




# FEED OUR HUNGRY CHILDREN/ BACKPACK MINISTRY OFFERING SUNDAY, OCTOBER 22


