



CONTRIBUTION TO FRIENDS OF KIRKWOOD Infrastructure Repair Capital Campaign


At the September 20, 2022 stated session meeting, at the recommendation of the Stewardship & Finance Ministry Team, the session voted to close out the Earl Whitaker Fund (balance of approximately \$10,100) and contribute the money to the Friends of Kirkwood Capital Campaign for infrastructure repairs, especially the septic system.

Many years ago, the family of Earl Whitaker, former Chief of the Wallace Police Department, established the Earl Whitaker Fund. The contributors stipulated that for the first ten years the session could use the interest generated to support youth in the community. After a period of ten years, the session could use the principal in an appropriate manner, particularly to serve youth.

Members of the Wallace Presbyterian Church were instrumental in the establishment of Camp Kirkwood in the 1950's. In partnership with the Wilmington Y, Friends of Kirkwood has re-energized the program at Camp Kirkwood and the camp has become a popular destination for children, youth, and congregations.

Pate Southerland, president of Friends of Kirkwood, will worship with us on Kirkwood Sunday, October 9, and receive the contribution for the Capital Campaign.

Dear Friends.

In April 1997, I completed and submitted a Personal Information Form to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This form was used to match me with congregations that were looking for pastors. Eventually the Pastor Nominating Committee from our congregation received my form, read it, contacted me, interviewed me, and extended a call to me to be pastor here at WPC. In a section describing my work, I wrote this, "I greatly enjoy working with people who say to me, 'This is what we want to do, this is where we want to go as a church — help us get there!"

As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, many (if not all) churches are taking stock of where they have been and where they are headed. The cultural and societal landscape has changed, especially for the church. Still, God continues to call us to bear a faithful witness to the good news of Jesus Christ. In the face of uncertainty, the temptation is to yearn for the way things used to be or to throw one's hands up in despair. But God promises to be with us as God guides us into the future.

Many of you know that I have kept a quote journal for many years. From time to time I read through the journal and find inspiration and challenges, particularly for my work as a minister and for the life of the church. Here are some thoughts for you to consider as we seek God's guidance for the future of WPC.

World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor. Celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936. Churches in other denominations were invited to celebrate with us from the beginning, but it wasn't until 1940 when the Department of Evangelism of the Federal Council of Churches (a predecessor body of the National Council of Churches) promoted extending the celebration to a number of churches around the world that the practice became widespread.
