#### Dear Friends,

Life as we know it has been turned upside down, even if your house didn't flood. As Dr. Dan said, "Even if your house didn't flood, everybody knows somebody — lots of somebodies — who have lost everything."

Around thirty-five households in our congregation alone were flooded, many extensively. As 1 Corinthians 12:26a says, "If one member suffers, all suffer together . . ." So many of you have responded so generously and sacrificially to help our church members and our neighbors in the wider Wallace and Duplin County community. Thank you! Please keep our church members who have been flooded in your prayers as they make many important and big decisions.

After Hurricane Floyd in 1999, most of us never expected to see another storm/flood as large, much less even larger and more catastrophic. As I looked through my records from our relief efforts in 1999, I found invoices dated from 2001 from vendors and businesses we paid for services provided to flood victims. We are so appreciative of the many immediate relief efforts from the Missouri Baptist Men, the Salvation Army, and many other groups and agencies. They have provided vital and welcome support. However, they will leave soon, and the relief/recovery effort will continue for a long time. We will need to find creative and caring ways to help meet the ongoing and changing needs of our friends and neighbors, just as we did following Hurricane Floyd.

Mollie Moore, who served as a Presbyterian missionary in Japan with her husband, Rev. Lardner Moore, for 45 years, is a child of our church. She sent me an email with her deepest sorrow at the reports of loss in our church and community and with prayers and best wishes as we all work together to help one another. Mollie included a prayer from St. Augustine, and I would like to offer it to you to use in the days and weeks to come.

Mollie wrote, "In the hard places of life, let us pray with St. Augustine: 'God of our life, there are days when the burdens we carry chafe our shoulders and weigh us down; when the road seems dreary and endless, the skies gray and threatening; when our lives have no music in them, and our hearts are lonely, and our souls have lost their courage. Flood the path with light, run our eyes to where the skies are full of promise; tune our hearts to brave *music; give us the sense of community* with heroes and saints of every age; and so quicken our spirits that we may be able to encourage the souls of all who journey with us on the road of life, to Your honor and glory.' Amen."



#### CENTERPOINT

Hurricane Florence is wreaking havoc. When natural disaster strikes, the first and urgent priority is safety. Newscasters alert us and we take necessary, imperative steps. But when the raging winds and torrential rains subside, the complex process of recovery slowly begins and it stretches on for months, if not years. Survivors of Hurricane Florence and the devastating flooding are left with haunting memories and images for a lifetime. Coupled with the overwhelming challenges of rebuilding lives, this catastrophe stretches human resiliency and stresses emotional wellbeing.

Serious emotional difficulties lurk underneath the overwhelming challenges of clearing up and rebuilding broken lives. The storms of trauma, depression, anxiety and addiction commonly intensify in the wake of a catastrophic storm. Yet we may be too preoccupied with regaining equilibrium in our lives to notice the toll that emotional turmoil is taking on our neighbors and on us.

People give up hope. "I don't believe I can ever get through this," someone may say. Another may respond, "Things will never get back to the way they were." Simple daily routine and ordinary activities become lifelines for those in despair, but lives are in turmoil. Have you noticed irritability or sudden mood swings in yourself and others? What about changes in usual ways of relating? Is there a difficulty in focusing? Do you find yourself more easily confused? Are others expressing a sense of isolation and withdrawal?

Strive for a gentle balance of gradual recovery and calm reflection. Take time to discern what "baby-steps" need to be taken next, and make time to rest and renew. In the face of destruction and despair, it is necessary for people to take time to mourn deep, lasting losses. Communities of faith must create safe, meaningful spaces for people to grieve and heal. Simply being aware of the vast emotional effects of hurricanes and flooding is the foundation for developing healing responses.

What has happened to us is unprecedented. Easy solutions are not possible. We must resist speaking shallow words that come quickly in our effort to comfort. As others struggle with hopelessness, seek to radiate steadfast love. "God is our refuge and strength – a very present help in times of trouble."
