Dear Friends,

At the August 21 session meeting, the elders and I approved a Child Protection Policy for our church. Because our church invites members of the congregation and community to entrust their children to us for LOGOS, Sunday School, PEP (preschool), Vacation Bible School, and youth fellowship activities, the session knew it was the right and caring thing to do to adopt this policy.

Here is the policy statement and purpose: "As a caring Christian community, we at Wallace Presbyterian Church are committed to providing a safe and nurturing environment for all children and for all those working with children involved in the congregational life of Wallace Presbyterian Church (WPC). The intention of this policy is to protect children from child abuse and to ensure that those working with children are not subjected to false or unwarranted charges of child abuse."

The policy begins with and is based on the story of Jesus blessing the children in Mark 10:13-16. Jesus says, "Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it."

Each church employee and volunteer who works with children and youth shall be required to review the Child Protection Policy and sign the Child Protection Covenant annually. The Child Protection Policy also requires appropriate clearances on

employees, applicants for employment, and volunteers participating in programs or activities involving children and youth.

These checks will be conducted with the greatest integrity using the services of a reputable service and the information will be maintained in the strictest confidentiality.

Our Child Protection Policy is the result of serious and hard work by a subcommittee appointed by the session. The committee members reviewed policies from numerous Presbyterian congregations and crafted a very good policy for our congregation, families, children, and youth. The Child Protection Policy will be added to the church's Administrative Manual, along with the Sexual Misconduct Policy. Copies of both policies are available for members of the congregation to review. We will also post these policies on our church's website at www.wallacepresbyterian.com.

Thank you for being a congregation that welcomes and loves our children and youth. Adopting these policies is one very important way we all live out the promises we make when a child is baptized in our church. May we always help the children and youth come to Jesus.




Presbyterian Answer to Hunger P.A.T.H. OFFERING Sunday, September 7

Our church treasurer reports Building & Grounds is over budget due to the work done on the Boney Street lot and the Southerland lot. Operating and Administration is over budget due to the insurance expense being paid in full for 20145. While giving is roughly \$9,500 ahead of the same six-month period in 2013 and other budgeted expenses are nearly the same (and on budget), we are still spending more than we are receiving.
