

Dear Friends,

Happy Easter!

Yes, Easter Sunday was last month, but the Easter season lasts for seven weeks, until the Day of Pentecost on Sunday, May 15.

In the weeks following his resurrection, our risen Lord appeared to his disciples and other followers in many different and unexpected places. He met Mary Magdalene by the tomb (she thought he was the gardener) and called her by name. He walked along the Emmaus Road with two followers who did not recognize him. He taught them about the scriptures and their eyes were opened when he broke bread with them at their table. He appeared to the disciples in a locked room and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit." A week later he appeared again and invited Thomas to put his fingers in his wounds. He fixed a breakfast of fish and bread on the beach and asked Peter three times, "Do you love me?"

The risen Jesus also gave his followers some instructions and work to do. He told them to wait

on the promised gift of the Holy Spirit. He told Peter three times, "Feed my lambs. Tend my sheep. Feed my sheep." He gathered his disciples on the mountain and commissioned them to make disciples of all nations, to baptize, and to teach. He promised them (and us), "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Do you think the disciples didn't recognize Jesus because they weren't 100% sure about the message, "He is risen," and because they met him in unexpected places? What about us this Easter season? Do we not recognize Jesus among us because he continually surprises us with his presence, his demands, and his promises?

Yes, it is Easter. . . and Easter means that Jesus is alive and present with us by the power of God's Holy Spirit. Jesus calls us by name, shows up in unexpected places, and asks us to do things we're not sure we can do, or even want to do. But remember, the risen Jesus Christ is with us always, and he still says, "Follow me." Will we?





# Holy Humor Sunday Bright Sunday April 3 Morning Worship

For centuries, in Catholic, Orthodox, and Protestant countries, Easter Monday and "Bright Sunday" (the Sunday after Easter) were observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection. Parishioners and pastors played practical jokes on each other, drenched each other with water, sang, and danced. It was a time for clergy and people to tell jokes and to have fun. The custom of Easter Monday and Bright Sunday celebrations were rooted in the musings of early church theologians (like Augustine, Gregory of Nyssa, and John Chrysostom) that God

played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. Easter was "God's supreme joke played on death." "Risus paschalis" – the Easter laugh, the early theologians called it. During worship on April 3, we will sing joyful songs and celebrate the good news of Jesus' resurrection from the dead as we enjoy some Holy Humor. Join us!
