For centuries, in Catholic, Orthodox, and Protestant countries, Easter Monday and "Bright Sunday" (the Sunday after Easter) were observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection. Parishioners and pastors played practical jokes on each other, drenched each other with water, sang, and danced. It was a time for clergy and people to tell jokes and to have fun.

The custom of Easter Monday and Bright Sunday celebrations were rooted in the musings of early church theologians (like Augustine, Gregory of Nyssa, and John Chrysostom) that God played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. Easter was "God's supreme joke played on death." "Risuspaschalis – the Easter laugh," the early theologians called it.

Dear Friends,

Over the years, many people have commented on the tagline of my emails: "Ask yourself this question: Where is God already at work in this situation?" That question has made a difference in my life and in my ministry. Based on the comments I have received, I think it has made a difference in other people's lives, also.

I came across that question when I joined the Pastor as Spiritual Guide program, led by Rev. Larry Williams, a retired Baptist minister. Since 2008, Larry has become a dear friend and mentor and has been my spiritual director for fourteen years. Larry recently published a book in which he compiled and edited spiritual writings of Rev. Samuel H. Miller, minister of the Old Cambridge (MA) Baptist Church from 1934 to 1959 and dean of Harvard Divinity School from 1959 until he died in 1968.

Because so many of you have commented on my email tagline. I want to share one of Samuel Miller's writings that Larry included in his book, entitled "God Already At Work." Samuel Miller wrote, "Nowhere is the ministry of Jesus more moving than at those times where God was already at work in people's lives. In all this work there was a radical presupposition that when he came near to anyone he could be sure that God had already worked in that person's experience. Every soul had been touched by the spirit of God. Indeed every soul had been created by God. sustained by God, and in a million places divine mercy had been present. The people may have been blind or deaf or dumb; or may have been moved at the time, even glorified and lifted up, and yet had forgotten it, or the person may been confused, weak of insight, lacking faith, and unwilling to grasp with a ready heart the gift of God's offering. But Jesus preached and acted everywhere as if people had known God, as if God had been busy in their lives as in his own, and if they had moved away from such experiences, if they had lost touch with God, he could remind them of what had been theirs, even help them find what they had never altogether known that they had possessed."

Samuel Miller's thoughts about "God Already At Work" are a good directive and reminder for us as a congregation as we engage in ministry. Instead of approaching our ministry as if everything depends on our efforts and energy, we can, instead, accept the invitation to join God who is already at work in people's lives. We can "act as if God has been busy in their lives as in our own." God is already at work with the same power that raised Jesus Christ from the dead. May everything we do as a congregation serve to remind people of what once had been theirs or "even help them


