Did you know that our congregation has a close relationship with the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina? In fact, we ARE the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina, along with ministers and members of the other 189 congregations within the bounds of presbytery.

Here are some ways our congregation is involved as part of our presbytery:

1. We support the Presbyterian Hunger Program through our quarterly P.A.T.H. (Presbyterian Answer to Hunger) offering;

2. We provide office space for Dr. Nancy Gladden (East Community Mission Coordinator), Rev. Eduardo Moreno (Hispanic Evangelist), and Bruce Garriss (Presbyterian Counseling Center);

3. We provide meeting space for numerous presbytery committees and events;

4. Our Presbyterian Women are actively involved in the presbytery's Presbyterian Women ministry;

5. Members of our congregation serve on the Committee on Ministry, the Stewardship & Finance Committee, and the Communications Committee;

6. and there are many more ways we are involved!

Here are some ways our presbytery supports our ministry at Wallace PC:

1. We have received grants for our Helping Hands Food Pantry and for our Summer Reading Ministry (through the Committee on Mission and Outreach);

2. We regularly use resources from the presbytery's Resource Center (and Kaye Bledsoe is always ready to help!);

3. Youth have participated in different activities (Youth Council, Montreat Youth Conference) and adults have traveled to Mexico in support of our partnership in Tabasco;

4. Dr. Nancy Gladden is always ready to help us as our Mission Coordinator;

5. and there are many more ways our presbytery supports us!

During the summer months, listening teams are fanning out across our entire presbytery to visit with sessions and congregational representatives. The values, wishes, and stories shared in this listening process will be gathered and used to shape our future as the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina. Elder Harriet Farrior and I are a listening team and have begun our work. Another listening team will visit with our church's representatives (along with folks from the Mt. Zion, Oak Plain, and Teachey Churches) some time in August. Our representatives are Dottie Obenour, Karla Casteen, Shirley Carlton, N.H. Carter, Jim Sills, Georgia Longest, and J Parker.

Please keep our congregation and our presbytery of Coastal Carolina in your prayers as we work together to strengthen our mutual ministries, both in the community of Wallace and beyond. At the Wednesday, July 16, 2014 stated session meeting, the elders and minister:

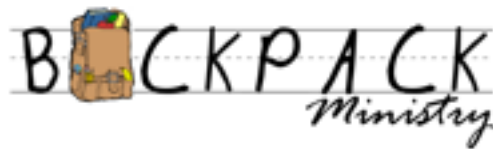
