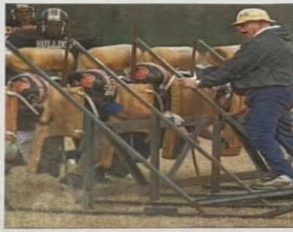

Dear Friends,

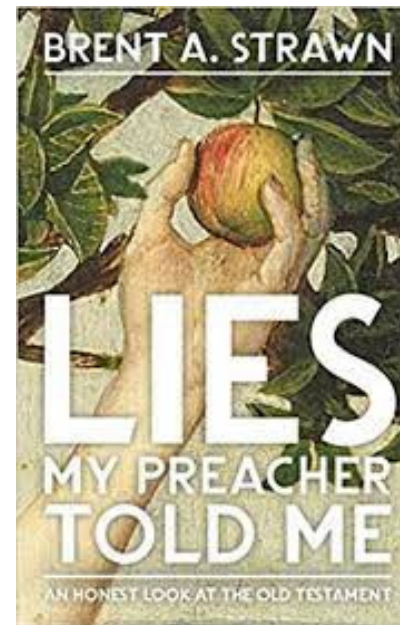
As I watch the 2020 + 1 Summer Olympics, I am inspired by and in awe of the athletes' performances. Understandably, the medal winners, especially the gold medalists, receive most of the attention. However, I think about the thousands of athletes who will compete and never receive a medal or even qualify for a medal round. Nevertheless, they have trained hard and are committed to do their best. Many have overcome daunting challenges to be in Tokyo and represent their countries. Some will set a personal best record. Even though we will never know who most of the athletes are, each of them can say "I am an Olympian!"

Did you know that there is much athletic imagery in the Bible, especially in the New Testament? One of my favorite scenes is found in Hebrews 12:1-2, which says, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him, endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God." This reminds me of the conclusion of the Olympic marathon, when the runners are usually greeted by a great crowd in the Olympic stadium, who urge them on. As marathoners say, "To finish is to win!" That certainly describes the Christian faith.

The apostle Paul also uses athletic imagery when he talks about the lifelong journey of Christian faith. In his letter to the Philippians, Paul writes, "Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus." (3:12-14)

As he neared the end of his ministry and his life, Paul wrote these words to Timothy, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing." (2 Timothy 4:7-8).

Paul was obviously familiar with athletic contests, as he demonstrates in 1 Corinthians 1:24-27, "Do you not know that in a race the runners all compete, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win it. Athletes exercise self-control in all things; they do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable one. So I do not run aimlessly, nor do I box as though

We are urged on by the saints who have gone before us, who have already run their race, fought the good fight, and kept the faith. 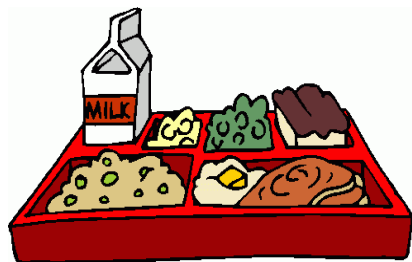

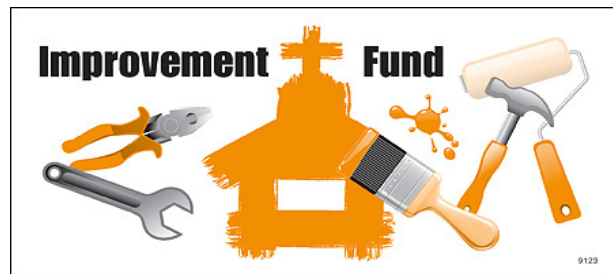
FEED OUR HUNGRY CHILDREN/BACKPACK MINISTRY OFFERING RESUMES

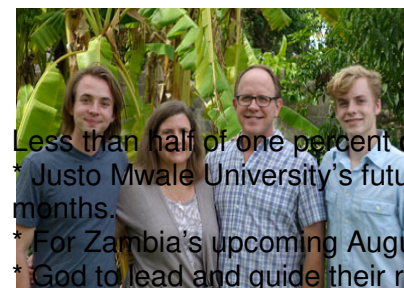

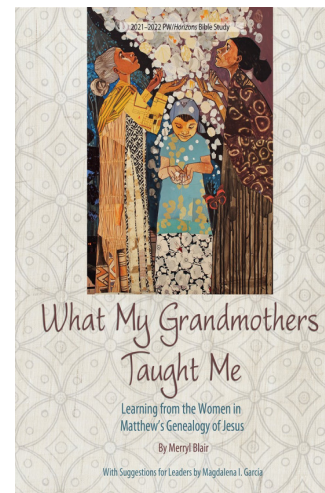
