Dear Friends,

On Easter Sunday, April 20, I will have the privilege of preaching about Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead. My sermon text will be Mark 16:1-8. In my study Bible, verses 9-20 are referred to as "The Longer Ending of Mark," and include some summary statements about Jesus appearing to the women and disciples. These concluding verses also contain statements about handling snakes and drinking deadly things, neither of which I plan to do during our Easter celebration!

If Mark 16:8 is the final verse in Mark's original gospel, it certainly is a strange way to end a gospel: "So they [the women] went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid."

Why would Mark end his gospel with this unusual story? We tend to sanitize and domesticate the Easter story along the lines of "Oh, isn't it nice that Jesus rose again?" We think in terms of lilies and spring and Easter clothes and ham for Easter lunch. But Christ's resurrection means the defeat of sin and death. His resurrection means we have hope for the future, after we die, and hope and inspiration for today, in a world that can be terrifying and amazing. The women at the tomb that first Easter Sunday surely didn't expect to find the tomb empty. What we know to be the greatest good news of all time must have upset them — "He is not here."

Obviously, the women did tell Jesus' disciples and others the good news. Otherwise, we wouldn't be celebrating Easter on April 20. That leaves us with what to do with the end of Mark's gospel. Could it be that Mark is writing for us and anyone else who reads his story? Mark seems to be asking, "What will you do with this terrifying, amazing, wonderful, unsettling news, that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead?"

What will we do with the Easter message, not just on Sunday, April 20, but every day? As Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 15, "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died... Therefore, my beloved, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

On April 1 (no foolin'!) I will begin my seventeenth year as your minister. I am profoundly grateful to God and all of you for the joy and opportunity to work together in ministry and mission as the Wallace Presbyterian Church. God bless you!

ACTIONS OF THE SESSION


At the Tuesday, March 18 meeting of the session, the elders and minister:


CHURCH NEWS . . . For Your Information
