

FEED OUR HUNGRY CHILDREN/ BACKPACK MINISTRYOFFERING Sunday, October 27



We will receive our monthly Feed Our Hungry Children/Backpack Ministry Offering on Sunday, October 27. This offering is an extension of Duplin Christian Outreach Ministries and provides lunches and weekend food for students in Duplin County Schools. During the 2023-2024 school year, the following schools were served: Beulaville Elementary, Chinquapin Elementary, Rose Hill-Magnolia Elementary, Wallace Elementary, and Wallace-Rose Hill High School. A total of 6,186 backpacks of food were provided over the weekends, 900 backpacks were provided over the summer, totaling 7,086 backpacks!
