Affirmation of Faith: From The Heidelberg Catechism (January 1563)

Question 69: How does baptism remind and assure you that Christ's one sacrifice on the cross benefits you personally?

Answer 69: In this way: Christ instituted this outward washing and with it promised that, as surely as water washes away the dirt from the body, so certainly his blood and his Spirit wash away my soul's impurity, that is, all my sins.

Question 70: What does it mean to be washed with Christ's blood and Spirit? Answer 70: To be washed with Christ's blood means that God, by grace, has forgiven our sins because of Christ's blood poured out for us in his sacrifice on the cross. To be washed with Christ's Spirit means that the Holy Spirit has renewed and sanctified us to be members of Christ, so that more and more we become dead to sin and live holy and blameless lives.


