Life Together in Christ: Experiencing **Transformation** *In Community*

You are invited to participate in our 2022 Lenten Study in the weeks leading up to Easter. This year we will read and talk about Ruth Haley Barton's book, Life Together in Christ: Experiencing Transformation in Community. The book is based on the Emmaus Road story in Luke 24:13-35 which tells about Cleopas and his companion meeting the risen Lord Jesus on the Emmaus Road on the first Easter afternoon.

Our small group discussions will provide opportunities to draw closer to Jesus and to one another as we walk along our journeys of faith. After all, as Ruth Haley Barton says, "all of us are on our own Emmaus Road — somewhere between the now and the not yet — in some area of our lives."

Dear Friends,

Julian of Norwich (1343-1416 A.D.), also known as Juliana of Norwich, Dame Julian, or Mother Julian, wrote a book called Revelations of Divine Love, which she based on a series of sixteen visions she received. She is thought to be the first woman to have written a book in English that has survived. Although church historians are not certain of her actual name, she is known as Julian of Norwich because she lived in one, small room at St. Julian's Church in Norwich. From there she counseled many people.

During her entire lifetime, the 100 Years' War raged in Europe. Also, she lived through the first (1348-1350) and second (1361-1362) waves of the bubonic plague, known as the Black Death in England. Historians estimate the pandemic killed 40-60% of the population in the first wave and 20% in the second wave. Obviously, Julian of Norwich was no stranger to suffering, either in her community or in her personal life. When she was thirty years old, she became very sick with a high fever and breathing difficulties. She had the sensation of being paralyzed. When her priest visited her, she had the first of many visions of Christ suffering on the cross. After this illness, she devoted herself to a life of prayer and union with God. That is when she began to live in the solitary room at St. Julian's Church of Norwich and counsel people in distress. As she experienced visions of Christ throughout her life, she wrote detailed descriptions of them which, when combined, became her book Revelations of Divine Love.

Julian's most well-known phrase may be, "All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well." This expression of faith is not the equivalent of burying your head in the sand and ignoring the reality of circumstances around you. Julian of Norwich hardly did that. Rather, her statement is grounded in a deep faith and trust in God who entered into our world and lives in his only Son Jesus to share in our suffering. To say that "all shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well" is not to say that what we go through in life is of no consequence. Instead, Julian's revelation of divine love is a lasting reminder of God's love and concern and divine purpose for all of creation and for each of us. Her confession of faith in God reminds us of the apostle Paul's words in Romans 8:37-39, "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who love us. For I am convinced

Responsibilities of Ministry Teams

Christian Education (Danielle Sills): work in planning and overseeing the entire Christian Education program (e.g., Sunday School, youth groups, outdoor ministries, confirmation, etc.); recruit and train Sunday School Superintendent, Sunday School teachers and youth leaders; Vacation Bible School.

Building and Grounds (Greg Maready, Hayes Ludlum):

oversee the maintenance and development of the physical plant and grounds; be responsible for opening and closing the building on Sundays and at other times when needed; develop a long-range building and grounds maintenance plan; supervise and communicate with the weekly cleaning crew; cleaning supplies.

Personnel (Hayes Ludlum, Darleen Weller): oversee all personnel matters; regularly review the personnel handbook and recommend policy changes as needed; conduct annual reviews of church staff; organize and compile the church Manual of Operations; oversee the church safety policies and background checks.

Worship and Music (Joyce Ange): oversee the worship life of the congregation; be responsible for ushers, greeters, and nursery workers, sanctuary guild, Kirkwood Sunday, community Advent services, communion, pulpit supply; sanctuary decorating for Advent/Christmas.

<u>Stewardship and Finance (Curt Simpson)</u>: oversee the financial matters of the congregation; prepare and submit the annual budget in consultation with the ministry teams; provide for the annual audit of church accounts; evaluate and propose special offerings; develop a year-round program of Stewardship education for the congregation; assist church treasurer with counting the weekly offerings.

Congregational Care (Darleen Weller, Kelli Norris): oversee the spiritual nurture and pastoral care of the congregation; work with/oversee Presbyterians Dining Together (PDT); develop and implement a new member identification, support, and assimilation program (e.g., identification, initial contacts, welcome baskets, follow-up contacts, new member classes, sponsors, etc.); work with the minister to develop and offer spiritual nurture opportunities (e.g., retreats, studies, etc.); congregational communication (e.g., website, e-mail communications, etc.).

Outreach (Patsy Ludium, Fred Burroughs): oversee the outreach ministries of our congregation, including the Helping Hands Food Pantry, Duplin Christian Outreach Ministries (DCOM), Celebrate Recovery, St. Nicholas project, disaster responses (e.g., special offerings, work teams, shelter operation in a local emergency, etc.); Zambia mission; develop a congregational awareness of mission and outreach needs and opportunities in our community, presbytery, denomination, and worldwide.
