

The beginning of this year has brought unprecedented challenges for our neighbors in California, who are now facing a devastating disaster. The harrowing images of wildfires consuming parts of Los Angeles and Ventura counties have deeply impacted us all, stirring our hearts with sorrow and compassion. Authorities are reporting this as a historic and deadly wildfire event. More than 40,000 acres have burned, with over 12,300 structures destroyed, entire communities wiped out, and tens of thousands of residents displaced. Currently, 92,000 residents are under evacuation orders, and 89,000 more remain in evacuation warning zones, meaning they may need to leave their homes at a moment's notice. Tragically, at least 24 lives have been lost, and the numbers continue to rise as fires remain uncontained. This is an ongoing disaster, and the extent of damage and loss continues to evolve, with figures expected to change as the situation develops.

As part of the ongoing response and in consultation with the Presbyteries of the Pacific, San Fernando, and San Gabriel, as well as the Synod of Southern California and Hawaii and its leadership, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) has been in communication with faith leaders in the affected communities. In addition to providing emotional and spiritual care, PDA has already released emergency grants to meet the urgent needs of the communities and to provide immediate assistance. Though the final outcomes of these fires are yet to be known, we are clear that the magnitude of the event will require the development of long-term projects and assistance, both for the physical and emotional long-lasting effects. Presbyterians in the region are participating in coordination calls with nonprofit and faith-based disaster organizations to ensure that no one is forgotten.

Financial support for relief efforts is being coordinated by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). If you would like to contribute, you can give directly through PDA online. You can also write a check to WPC with "Wildfire Relief" in the memo line, and we will send it on. You can drop off checks at the church, place them in the offering plate during worship services, or mail to WPC at PO Box 717 Wallace, NC 28466.

Hollywood Presbyterian Church was one of the most prestigious churches in the nation; one with a long and rich history, having been pastored by such influential church leaders as: Drs. Louis Evans, Richard Halverson, and Lloyd John Ogilvie. (both Halverson and Ogilvie went on to serve as chaplains to the US Senate).

A featured article about Presbyterians in general and this church in particular appeared in LIFE magazine (January 10, 1949) and spoke of a very different day and time than today. One in which huge crowds lined up each week to get into the 1,700 seat sanctuary; a time when men wore dark suits and white shirts, and the women came in dresses, hats and gloves! And it was a time of great success and growth, with scores of people joining each month and the Sunday School program overflowing with children!

However, the Hollywood Presbyterian Church, after reaching its highpoint in the 1950's, began to lose members in the succeeding decades, despite the fact that it had been home to some of the most notable preachers of the 20th century. The community changed...the culture changed...and it was hard for the church to adapt. One of the on-going struggles was how to deal with the persistent memory of "how things used to be," and the painful realization that those days weren't coming back.

Hollywood Presbyterian is certainly very different today than it was when that LIFE article was written in 1949, but in other ways it hadn't changed at all: It's still committed to sharing the timeless truth of God's love and grace for all, except now they're willing to go about it in new and fresh ways that speaks to a new generation.

As we prepare for the next installed pastor, let us remember that while times change, and while our community and culture may change, let us be clear about what does not change: Our God does not change, nor does the need to share the timeless truth of His love for us all. Let us remember and rejoice in what God has done with us in the past, but let's not look in that direction too long, or too longingly, lest we miss what God plans to do with us -- and through us -- now, and in the future!

Building Repairs and Painting

Recently, the Session identified the need to have the exterior of our beautiful church repaired and painted. Subsequently, the Building and Grounds Committee reached out to our own Dwight Hall, owner of DPH General Contractors. Dwight assessed the needs of the exterior of our church and presented a plan to the Session to address the following issues:

- -Power wash all the buildings and scrape all areas to be painted.
- -Clean the brick on the Currie Building to remove white stains.
- -Repair or replace all rotten wood on the church.
- -Rebuild the louvers on the towers on the front of the church.
- -Remove and replace the windows in the church office.
- -Paint, with two coats of paint, the trim/doors, excluding the stained glass windows.
- -Paint the exterior wrought iron handrails.

The Session voted unanimously to authorize DPH General Contractors to oversee the proposed work and repairs began in November of last year. All the repairs have now been completed and the exterior of our church has been restored to like new condition.

The Session would like to thank Dwight and DPH for a job well done.


