#### Dear Friends,

As we celebrate our nation's independence this month, here is an interesting historical item about worship in pre-Revolutionary times. This is taken from a newsletter article written by Rev. Carl Uzzell, one of our former pastors and Karla Casteen's father, in March 1977.

"Twenty years before the outbreak of the Revolutionary War, Benjamin Franklin made the following report regarding a certain Rev. Mr. Beatty who was chaplain to the troops under Franklin's command on the northwestern frontier of the Pennsylvania Colony.

'We had for our Chaplain a zealous Presbyterian minister, Mr. Beatty, who complained to me that the men did not generally attend his prayers and exhortations. When they enlisted, they were promised, besides pay and provisions, a gill of rum a day, which was punctually served out to them, half in the morning and half in the evening; and I observed they were punctual in attending to receive it; upon which I said to Mr. Beatty — "It is perhaps below the dignity of your profession to act as steward of the rum; but if you were to distribute it out only just after prayers, you would have them all about you." He liked the thought,

undertook the task, and with the help of a few hands to measure out the liquor, executed it to satisfaction, and never were prayers more generally and more punctually attended. So that I think this method preferable to the punishment inflicted by some military laws for non-attendance on Divine service."

I won't be distributing half a gill of rum before morning worship services this summer, but I encourage you to make it your practice to "punctually attend" worship when you are in town. We will be worshiping God, singing God's praises, enjoying fellowship with God's people, listening for God's Word in the Word read and proclaimed and in beautiful music. We will be remembering God's grace in our lives in Jesus Christ and how we can faithfully and gratefully respond to God's goodness in many different ways.

I look forward to seeing you in worship when you are in town this summer. Be safe when you're on vacation! Don't forget your church when you're on the road and at the beach!





# NEWS FROM THE 222nd GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (U.S.A.)

Co-Moderators Elected

On the 60th anniversary of making women eligible to be pastors, and the 85th anniversary of ordaining its first woman elder, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) made history again Saturday, electing two women as co-moderators for the first time. Denise Anderson, a pastor from National Capital Presbytery, and Jan Edmiston, a presbytery executive from Chicago, were overwhelmingly elected Co-Moderators of the 222nd General Assembly (2016). By the way, it also was the first-ever election of co-moderators, which was possible because of a change made in the standing rules just two years ago. Moreover, in the history of the denomination, women had never been elected as both moderator and vice moderator. (Information taken from www.pcusa.org/news)
