5:30 PM: Walking Taco Dinner



ACTIONS OF THE SESSION

At the May 21, 2024 stated session meeting, the elders and pastor:

• were led in an opening prayer by Elder Kevin Johnson;

Clerk's report:

- a) "thank you" note from "Dr. O" of Duplin County Schools for our prayers
- b) Wedding of Katie Price (member) & Ryan Sutherland on May 17 in New Bern, NC.
- c) Presbytery Zoom Meeting on Saturday, June 15.
- Presbyterian Women Spring Gathering was held Tuesday, May 14 at the Rose Hill Restaurant. 24 members of Presbyterian women attended. PW are searching for a new moderator and vice-moderator;
- Holy Cow! Consulting's Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) 89 completed the survey (about 75% of avg. worship attendance), Congregational Luncheon Sunday, June 9 for the congregation to hear a summary of the Holy Cow! Report;
- **RIP Medical Debt Relief** The East Community of our Presbytery raised \$40,724.53 which eliminates over \$4 million dollars of medical debt. WPC contributed \$2,375;
- Rise Against Hunger 10,000 meals were packaged by 50 volunteers and \$4,000 was raised to host the event;
- End of the year Water Party June 7, 4:30-8:30 (Jennifer Johnson);
- Congregational Care is in the process of planning events for the congregation;
- Interim Pastor Contract-Curt Simpson, Sandy Cobb, and Joyce Ange met with Robert Lapp to discuss renewing the interim contract for another year beginning August 28. Curt Simpson made a motion to not make any changes to the current contract. Sandy Cobb- second. Session unanimously voted for the contract as is.
- Robb Lapp will be on vacation June 28-July 9 & be back at the church on July 10;
- Were led in closing prayer by Pastor Robb Lapp.

Dear WPC family,

Where Is WPC In The Call Process?

- 1. WPC's Session authorized a Transitional Ministry Team (Krisitn Cottle, Geneva Maready, Devan Riley, Jason Rouse, Dan Robinson, and Lindsay Sidmore) to complete a Mission Study. The study has included meeting with community leaders and partners to hear their hopes and dreams for our community. The Holy Cow! Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) and the feedback session at the **luncheon on Sunday, June 9** is how we are engaging with our members.
- 2. The Session and Transitional Ministry Team will take the information from the Mission Study and create a Mission Statement that will be used in the Mission Discernment Profile (MDP).
- 3. WPC's Session will plan with the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina's Commission on Ministry (COM) criteria for the terms of call (position name, salary, employment type, job description, and mission statement).
- 4. The Session will request permission from COM to form a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC).
- 5. The Wallace Presbyterian Church's 2024 Nominating Committee will place in nomination for a congregational vote a slate of candidates representative of the whole congregation to serve on the PNC.
- 6. After the election of the PNC by the congregation, the PNC will prepare a MDP.
- 7. After the MDP is approved by COM, it will be submitted to the Presbyterian Church USA's Church Leadership Connection (CLC) system. This is how candidates will get to know about WPC and our position description.
- 8. The PNC will begin to receive matches and referrals of potential candidates from CLC, and conduct interviews.
- 9. Once a candidate has been selected and COM has approved the call, the Session will call for a meeting of the congregation to vote on the pastoral candidate. If elected, WPC will welcome your next installed pastor.

The PNC has **not** yet been elected. Once the Mission Study has been completed and a Mission Statement prepared, the Session will request permission from COM to form a PNC. In the past, the Mission Study was done by the PNC, now it is done by the Session. This change is why it may feel like it is taking a long time to form a PNC. We covet your prayers as we work through the call process. If you have questions or concerns, please contact Robert Lapp, Interim Pastor.


UNDUE MEDICAL DEBT

This will serve those in need in Brunswick, Carteret, Duplin, Lenoir, New Hanover, Onslow, and Pender counties, with funds exceeding those debts going to medical debt in other regions throughout NC. Recipients will receive a letter expressing that Presbyterian Churches of the East Community of the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina have aided in eliminating their medical debt.

The East Community raised \$40,724.53 exceeding our goal of \$20,000 and WPC contributed \$2,375! Thanks to your generosity, over 4 million dollars of medical debt has been eliminated!
