FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Someone recently asked me, "When is Fat Tuesday this year?" The answer is March 4. "Fat Tuesday," or Mardi Gras, refers to the practice of the last night of eating richer, fatty foods before the ritual fasting of the Lenten season, which begins on Ash Wednesday.

Fasting is an ancient Christian discipline, especially during the season of Lent. We Presbyterians are not particularly familiar with physical fasting, although Christians of many different traditions find this discipline nurtures and strengthens their faith.

I invite you to join me on Sunday afternoons during the Lenten season in March and April, beginning on March 9, to "pray through the psalms in Lent." This will be a time of serious reflection, prayer, and fellowship. Please join me and your fellow church members for this time of devotion and preparation.

Perhaps you will practice the Christian discipline of physical fasting during this Lenten season. If not, here is a different kind of "fasting." This was written by William Arthur Ward, a 20th century American author, teacher, and pastor.

- Fast from judging others; Feast on the Christ dwelling in them.
- Fast from emphasis on differences; Feast on the unity of life.
- Fast from apparent darkness; Feast on the reality of light.
- Fast from thoughts of illness; Feast on the healing power of God.
- Fast from words that pollute; Feast on phrases that purify.
- Fast from discontent; Feast on gratitude.
- Fast from anger; Feast on patience.
- Fast from pessimism; Feast on optimism.
- Fast from worry; Feast on divine order.
- *Fast from complaining; Feast on appreciation.*
- Fast from negatives; Feast on affirmatives.
- Fast from unrelenting pressures; Feast on unceasing prayer.
- *Fast from hostility; Feast on non-resistance.*
- Fast from bitterness; Feast on forgiveness.
- Fast from self-concern; Feast on compassion for others.
- Fast from personal anxiety; Feast on eternal truth.
- Fast from discouragements; Feast on hope.
- Fast from facts that depress; Feast on verities that uplift.
- Fast from lethargy; Feast on enthusiasm.
- Fast from thoughts that weaken; Feast on promises that inspire.
- Fast from shadows of sorrow; Feast on the sunlight of serenity.
- Fast from idle gossip; Feast on purposeful silence.
- Fast from problems that overwhelm; Feast on prayer that strengthens.




FEED OUR HUNGRY CHILDREN BACKPACK BUDDIES MINISTRY OFFERING SUNDAY, MARCH 23

We recently received a thank you letter from Dr. Wynand Retief, Old Testament professor at Justo Mwale Theological University College in Lusaka, Zambia.

Dear Brothers and sisters

I got the message from Craig Stoll that you paid up for all 30 Hebrew-English Dictionaries that I ordered, instead of only the 15 for the BTh 4 class. This is a wonderful surprise!Thanks so much for you abundant generosity and spirit of sacrificial love. Apart from the 15 copies which will go to the fourth years - the moment they arrive, I will give copies to those students of the second and third year classes who are faithful and loyal attenders of our 7am reading group. They are finished with their grammar course, and putting their Hebrew into practice by reading the psalm of the week together in the Hebrew text - of course accompanied by other translations. This reading is devotional. So in that way I try to bring academic depth in relation to spirituality. As for the fourth years, they are reading Jonah three periods a week, struggling with the Hebrew, but hopefully getting to love the revelations brought about by the original text. So your gift is really a spiritual one, one that we pray will bear much fruit for the church in future.

A request: please send me a group photo of you. When the dictionaries arrive, they will be ceremonially handed over, and for that occasion I want to project your photo for all to see. It will be very helpful for our students to see their sponsors and form a picture of you when they thank you for their gifts. The whole idea behind these ventures is to build relationships.


