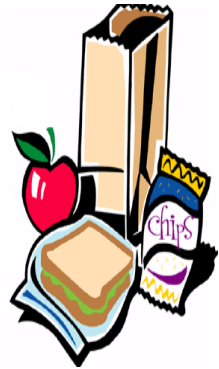

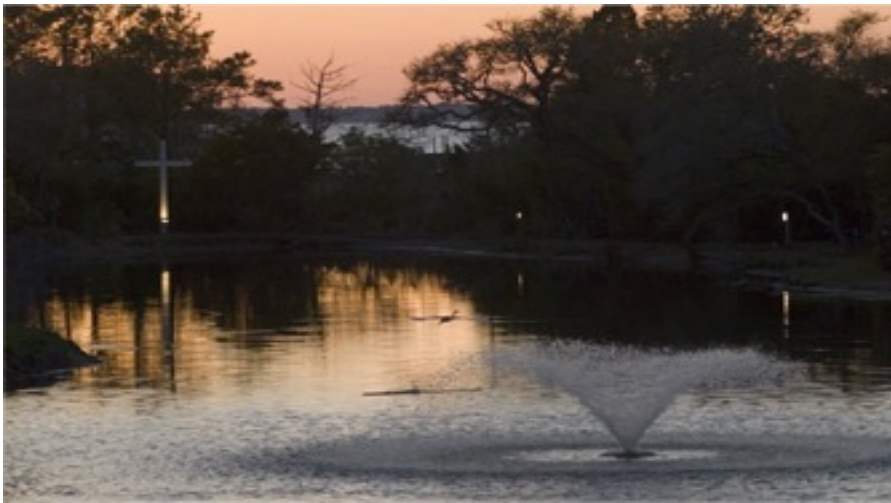

ACTIONS OF THE SESSION

At the Tuesday, October 20, 2015 meeting of the session, the elders and minister:

- * were led in an opening devotion and prayer by Elder Rick Batchelor;
- * conducted the meeting as a worship service;
- * received Tammy Ren Callihan as a member by Reaffirmation of Faith (Tammy will be presented at the October 25 worship service);
- * studied God's Word in Romans 8:1-17 and discussed an article "Regarding Ruling Elders: leading with the spirit";
- * heard about and prayed for pastoral care concerns in the congregation;
- * approved minutes from the September 15, 2015 stated session meeting and the September 27, 2015 congregational meeting;
- * heard a report from Elder George Francis about the October 10, 2015 stated meeting of the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina;
- * received reports from Ministry Teams;
- * approved three recommendations from the Christian Education Ministry Team regarding curricula for Sunday School classes: (1) new curriculum, "Growing in Grace and Gratitude," for ages 3-10; (2) The Working Class (meets in the Blue Room) to use the Convergence DVD series; (3) The Alternative Class (meets in Room 304) to use Modern Parables DVD series in November, to study Advent themes in December, and to begin a study of Daniel and the Twelve Prophets in January;
- * approved a 2016 budget as recommended by the Stewardship & Finance Ministry Team and agreed to interpret the budget with a narrative budget;
- * agreed to promote South Carolina flood relief efforts for the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program by encouraging members to contribute money and items on November 8 for clean-up kits;
- * agreed to inform the congregation of the opportunity to contribute to the "Signs of Christmas" billboard campaign sponsored by Johnson Nursery;
- * called a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, December 6 for these purposes: (1) to present the 2016 budget as information; (2) to act on proposed changes in the minister's terms of call; and (3) to hold the annual meeting of the corporation;
- * reviewed the plan for worship leadership and pastoral care for the month of November when the minister is recovering from surgery;
- * were led in a closing prayer by Elder Zach Casteen.

South Carolina Flood Relief Sunday, November 8

In response to the call from the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program for clean-up kits to help with the flood relief/recovery in South Carolina, our session invites you to participate in putting together clean-up

On Sunday, November 8, you are invited to bring any or all of the following items to worship. During the presentation of our tithes and offerings, you will have the chance to bring your items forward. Youth and adults will assemble the buckets later and they will be delivered to South Carolina.

If you would like to make a financial contribution, the estimated cost of a full clean-up kit is \$56. There will be a bucket available for contributions on November 8. Make checks payable to Wallace Presbyterian Church and mark “Flood Relief.”

- 1 — 5-gallon bucket with resealable lid*
- 5 — scouring pads
- 7 — sponges, assorted sizes
- 1 — scrub brush
- 2 pair — latex gloves (like Playtex®)
- 5 — dust masks
- 1 — pkg. cleaning towels (18 reusable, like EasyWipes®)
- 1 — box dry laundry detergent, 50-78 oz.
- 1 — liquid concentrated household cleaner (like Lysol®) 12 oz.
- 1 — bottle liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn®), 24-28 oz
- 1 — 1 pkg. clothespins, 48-50 Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- 1 pair — work gloves
- 1 — 24 to 28 count roll heavy-duty trash bags (30-45 gallon, remove from carton)
- 1 — bottle insect repellent (pump, drops or lotion; not aerosol), 6-9 oz.

Please purchase all liquids in plastic bottles. Send only new, unopened materials. Put all items in the plastic bucket, packed securely to avoid damage during shipment, and seal lid with packing tape.
*Some local fast-food restaurants are willing to give pickle buckets (or other 5-gallon buckets with re-sealable lids) or offer them for a small fee. These can be washed out and used for the cleanup buckets.



Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes need to be turned in by Sunday, November 15, 2015

A Shoebox Full of Love

It’s time for Operation Christmas Child boxes to be filled again! If you would like to fill up a shoebox for Operation Christmas Child, you need to bring it to the church by Sunday, November 15. You can bring your boxes to the church anytime from now until November 15. We will then take the boxes down to First Baptist (the collection center), and they’ll be shipped off to children in time for Christmas!

Be sure and pick up an Operation Christmas child brochure (located on a table in the Currie building). You can use a shoebox from the fellowship hall or a clear, plastic reusable shoebox (Wal-Mart & Dollar Tree has these). Fill the box with the suggested items-- small toys, pens, crayons, toothbrush and paste, flashlight with batteries, etc. Please do not include damaged items, war-related toys, chocolate, food, liquids or lotions, medications, breakable items or aerosol cans. Then gift wrap the lid and bottom of the box separately (you don’t have to gift wrap clear plastic boxes), label with boy or girl tag from the brochure, mark the age, enclose \$7 for shipping, put a rubber band around it, and bring it to church on the 15th. And most importantly, send it off with prayer for the child who receives the box! Thanks for helping!! And remember to bring the shoeboxes on or before November 15th.
