## **SUNDAY, OCTOBER 5**

Every year on the first Sunday in October, on October 5 this year, Christians around the globe celebrate World Communion Sunday. It is a day to remember that Jesus Christ is the Head of the Church. Holy Communion joins us in Christian unity. This sacrament invites us to focus on the holiness of communion with God and one another.

On World Communion Sunday - Presbyterians, in conjunction with other denominations and believers worldwide, participate in communion to recognize our unity in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Now, perhaps more than ever, we are called to extend healing and hope which will guide us to becoming a new creation in Christ. Join us as we celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper during worship on World Communion Sunday, October 5. All are welcome at the table!





Beloved,

World Communion Sunday will be celebrated on October 5 this year. The first World Communion Sunday was in 1933 at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA. The vision was to promote Christian unity, to highlight the importance of our common mission, and to remind us that we are dependent upon one another to fulfill that mission. But it was not until World War II that World Communion began to grow in popularity. It symbolized an effort to show unity during a time of great division and a global war, and that, despite all evidence to the contrary, we truly are one in the Spirit.

World Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church in 1936. Other denominations were invited to join in this celebration from the beginning, but it wasn't until 1940 when the Department of Evangelism of the Federal Council of Churches (a predecessor body of the National Council of Churches) promoted it that the practice became widespread.

Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the globe, witnessing that the mission of the church founded on Jesus Christ is to peacefully serve a broken and hurting world together as one.

This year for World Communion Sunday at WPC, the Rev. Jonathan Watson will be preaching and celebrating the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Jonathan retired from parish ministry in 2022, having served Cape Fear Presbyterian Church (Wilmington) and Falls Church Presbyterian Church (Virginia). He continues to minister through his work on the East Community Commission on Ministry. An experienced photographer, his love for God and the diversity of Creation continually inspire his images. Jonathan regularly photographs presbytery meetings/events and was the chief photographer to the General Assembly for The Presbyterian Outlook. He also did the portraits of Dr. Phil Gladden in our church. He and his wife Darcie have a son, James, who will soon begin his Senior year at Wake Forest University, and a seven-month-old puppy named Lucy.

- Approved Dan Robinson to share a Moment for Mission on Sunday, October 12, about the Gideons and how individuals can support their ministry.
- Approved a request from Wallace-Rose Hill High School to host a meal for the JV and Varsity soccer team.
- Joys and concerns were shared and the meeting was adjourned with prayer.


# FEED OUR HUNGRY CHILDREN/ BACKPACK MINISTRY OFFERING Sunday, October 26

# **Make October "Faith Month"**

And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

Hebrews 11:6

October will be here before we know it. And October ends with Reformation Day, because on October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed his Ninety-five Theses to the door of Castle Church in Wittenberg, lighting the fuse that exploded into the Protestant Reformation.

I have a suggestion for you. Since one of the great cries of the Reformation became *Sola Fide* (faith alone), how about making this October "Faith Month." For private worship and reflection you could select and meditate on Scriptures that explain what faith is and how it works. There's a lot to chew on. In Romans alone you'll find faith mentioned 35 times, in Hebrews 31 times, in Galatians 19 times. In John's Gospel you won't find faith mentioned at all! But you will find some form of the word "believe" 85 times. It's worth pondering why. Or you could memorize some or all of Hebrews 11 (yes, you *can*!).

Here's another suggestion. An updated version of John Piper's book, *Future Grace: The Purifying Power of the Promises of God*, is good reading. It's the best thing I've ever read on what the Bible means when it commands us to live by faith. And it's very practical. It's a manual for Christian living. And the great thing is that it has 31 chapters. You could read one chapter each day of October and come away better equipped to fight the fight of faith. (1 Timothy 6:12).

Wouldn't it be great if on Reformation Day your thanksgiving to God for the gift of faith was deeper and richer because you meditated on the Bible in your language and received clear, biblical teaching? And what an honor it would be to the brothers and sisters who paid a high price to secure these for you.

Make October "Faith Month." You will not regret pressing deeper into what it means to "walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7).
