Dear Friends.

I am a Christian. I am a Protestant Christian. I am a part of the Reformed family of Protestantism. I am a member of the Presbyterian branch of the Reformed faith. I am a baptized and confirmed member of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) of the Reformed family of faith. I am an ordained minister member of the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and pastor of the Wallace Presbyterian Church. Most of all, I am a beloved child of the Sovereign God.

You can draw your own family tree of faith. If you are a part of the Wallace Presbyterian Church, you are part of a theological and faith tradition that has its roots in an event that happened on October 31, 1517. Five hundred years ago this month, Martin Luther, a Catholic monk and theology professor, nailed his ninety-five theses on the chapel door at the castle in Wittenburg, Germany. Luther didn't set out to start a new church. He was concerned about the problems he saw in his beloved church. Nevertheless, Luther's action 500 years ago led to what we call the Protestant Reformation.

As Presbyterians, we are part of that Protestant, Reformed family of faith. As Presbyterians, we share basic beliefs with all Christians, and we emphasize certain beliefs and ways of living. We believe in the sovereignty of God, who created and sustains everything. We believe Jesus Christ is Lord of all creation and our lives. We believe the inspired Word of God is the rule of life and faith and the living Word that

testifies to salvation in Jesus Christ. We believe Jesus was raised from the dead by the power of God's Holy Spirit, that we may have abundant life now and in the future. We believe God saves us through his grace and mercy in Jesus Christ. We believe God calls each of us to a life of worship and service, to God and to our neighbors. We believe in a life of stewardship, using wisely and faithfully the gifts God gives us for the tasks he calls us to do. We believe in the use of the mind in the service of God, since God has created us to seek knowledge and truth. We believe that nothing in life or in death will be able to separate us from God's love in Jesus Christ.

As one of my seminary professors told us, "Being a Presbyterian is not the only way to be a faithful Christian, but it's a good and scriptural way to be a Christian." As we celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation on Sunday, October 29, we can give thanks to God for the faith he has given us in Jesus Christ and for his claim on our whole lives. The first question of the Heidelberg Catechism (1563), in our Presbyterian Book of Confessions, asks and answers, "What is your only comfort, in life and in death? That I belong — body and soul, in life and in death — not to myself but to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ." May it always be so!
