- \* Keeping all information confidential

Volunteers are trained as child advocates for abused and neglected children. Child advocates and attorneys work together to champion for children's needs in court. Child advocates promote a safe and permanent home for children.

Dear Friends,

*When men and women are ordained as Ruling Elders and Teaching Elders (Ministers of Word and Sacrament) in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), they are asked nine constitutional questions. The first eight questions are the same for elders and ministers. Question #9 differs only because Ruling and Teaching Elders are ordained to different functions and service in the congregation and for the church at large.*

*At the August stated session meeting, our elders and I discussed the meaning and importance of ordination question #8: “Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?” We watched a video of an interview with Dr. Rodger Nishioka who described imagination in terms of being aware and looking for God at work all around us (including in our lives) and then finding creative ways to share that good news with other people. In our discussion of serving with imagination, we heard the idea, “The promise to serve with intelligence is a promise to encourage creativity and creative problem solving.”*

*Our discussion around the session table was guided by these two questions: Where do you see imagination at work in our congregation? What are the hindrances to imagination in our congregation? As we continue to make our way out of the COVID-19 pandemic, it will be important for us as a church to imagine what future God has in mind for us. It’s an understatement to say that things have changed. As we take stock of where we have come from, where we are, and where we are headed, imagination can play a key role in helping us discern what new things God is calling us to do.*

*I recently read some challenging thoughts in a book of devotions. One was the idea that, in the church, we are prone to “embalming the past and substituting it for the present.” A similar thought is, “We fear failure more than we love life. We are careful to do only what we have always done and know how to do well, so we never break the dull repetition of the old routine for the new creation in God.” The key to changing such repetition appears to be using our imaginations so we can see and participate in the new creation in God.*

*In the coming months, the elders and I will invite you all to share your ideas, hopes, dreams, and prayers for our congregation as we move ahead as God’s people. While ordination question #8 is used specifically when we ordain Ruling and Teaching Elders, with just a bit of tweaking, it can be a good question for everyone in our congregation to ask himself or herself: “Will I seek to serve God and God’s people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?”*

*Just imagine what we might be able to do, with God’s help!*

At the Tuesday, August 16, 2022 session meeting, the elders and minister:

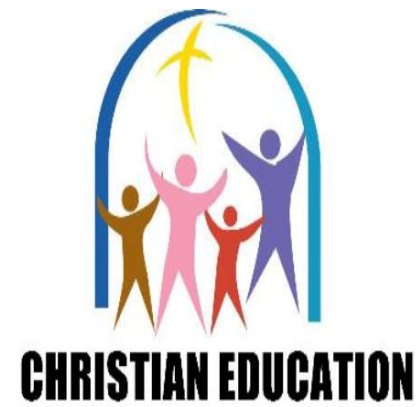
- \* conducted the meeting as a worship service;

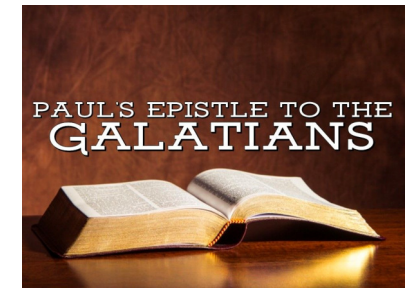
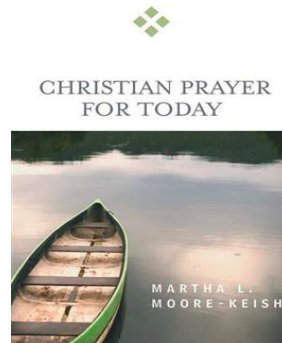
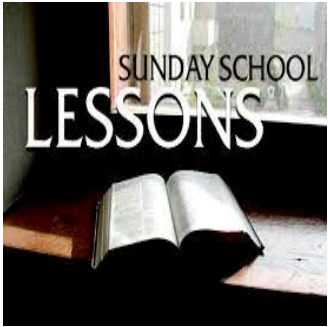


### FEED OUR HUNGRY CHILDREN/BACKPACK MINISTRY OFFERING
